## Team Expectations

## Grading Policy

- School-wide return to traditional grading scale.
  - 100-90% = A
  - 89-80% = B
  - **■** 79-70% = C
  - → 69-60% = D
  - ► 59-50% = F (not lower than 50% on <u>FULLY ATTEMPTED</u> work)
  - "M" Missing work is recorded as an "M" and counts as 0% until completed.
  - Blank spaces or "Turned In" check marks with no score in Infinite Campus just mean that the score is not yet recorded and do not count against the grade.

## Late Work Policy
