Behavior Star System - Good behavior in the classroom and at specials will be rewarded. Inappropriate behavior in classrooms and at specials will be managed by using our effective star system. Each child starts every day with a green star. They will have the opportunity to turn to blue for "star"

behavior. This will be a celebration because a child has gone above and beyond without the teacher asking. So, for example, a child may show exceptional listening skills, or they may help another child pick-up all of their crayons that have fallen on the floor. Please celebrate with your child if they receive a blue star. They will receive a Rhino Reward as a reward. Inappropriate choices will result in a yellow or even red star. The students will be encouraged throughout the day to make better choices for an opportunity to earn their green star back. If they are on green or blue each day of the week, they will be able to participate in Fun Friday. If they have two yellows or one red during the week, they will not be able to participate in Fun Friday. Your child's color will come home daily on his/her homework calendar. Fun Friday – The students can participate in Fun Friday by earning green or blue stars each day in a week. Fun Friday is a special time for them to choose their own activity and interact with other students. It is a great incentive for great behavior. Whole school behavior R-respectful I-inclusive S-safe E-engaged Students will earn Rhino Rewards throughout the day for demonstrating these behaviors. They can "buy" rewards in the classroom using these tickets. Homework Binders - Your child will bring home a binder every day. This binder is to help keep them organized and should come back and forth every day. The left side will consist of papers that should be looked at with your child and kept at home. The right side, as well as any sheets in the page protectors, should be returned to school. Approximately 30-50 minutes of CTA homework will be assigned nightly. Please read the homework calendar, help your student complete the assignments and sign the calendar. The signed calendar, completed homework, and behavior star chart MUST be returned daily. Incomplete homework will be completed during recess time. Homework is expected to be returned complete and correct. Parents, please make sure the homework is checked to insure it is turned in without any mistakes. As part of the nightly homework, your child is expected to spend 15-20 minutes reading nightly. There is a section on the homework slip to log the nightly reading. The more we read, the smarter we get!

High Frequency Word Lists (Frye List) - Your child will start keeping a list of high frequency words in their binders. Please have your child practice these words until he/she can read each word in less than 3 seconds. When you feel your child is ready, sign the bottom of the paper and I will test them. When passed, he/she will be rewarded and will move on to the next list. There are 20 lists (1000 words) in first grade. **Weekly Testing: Reading -** We will take a comprehension test over our current reading story. We will also take a spelling and phonogram test every Friday. The students will receive 30 new spelling words every week. Spelling dictation tests will also begin later in the year. Handwriting-Handwriting will be assessed bi-weekly for the 1st semester and monthly during the rest of the school year. Math - Assessment of your child's progress occurs frequently. We will strive for 80 percent mastery on all math assessments. All missed objectives will be reviewed and retaught. Math facts assessments will start weekly during the 2nd week of school. Progress Reports/Report Cards- Parents will have access to a progress report mid-quarter via Infinite Campus. Report cards will be available as well at the conclusion of each quarter. Your child will receive a percentage based on 100 for the following areas: math, reading, writing. All other subjects will be graded by the following codes: Excelling (E), Satisfactory (S), Improving (I), and Needs Improvement (N). Conferences will be held in August and February. **Book Orders** – Once a month you will find a book order in your child's binder. There are wonderful age-appropriate books to choose from at a very reasonable price. Your participation is voluntary. Ordering online is easy at www.scholastic.com/bookclubs. Our username is MrsVDBsClass and the password is firstgrade. You may also send the completed order form back in an envelope with a check made out to the appropriate book club. Star of the Week – I look forward to choosing a star of the week each week. This is such a special honor for the students. When your child is chosen, he/she will bring home a poster to complete and share with the class. **Dress Code –** Spaghetti straps are not allowed. Please have your child use the 2-finger test when determining if a strap is wide enough. Also, hats are not permitted inside the classrooms but may be worn outside. Shorts should be a moderate length. Hair must be a natural color.

You may consider sending your child to school with a light sweatshirt. It can get chilly in the classroom. You may also want to consider sending your child in sneakers each day as we will visit the playground for daily recess. **Lunch Money –** Due to USDA regulations, school meals will not be universally free for the 2022-23 school year.
