In October 2006, Chandler Education Foundation was awarded a five-year federal Parent Information and Resource Center Grant from the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Innovation and Improvement. Working in partnership with a network of state, regional and local partners, Arizona State PIRC assists parents, teachers, principals, administrators and other school personnel in meeting the educational needs of children in the state. This past year, Arizona State PIRC provided statewide services and materials to 329,233 parents, 172 schools and professional development to 866 school personnel.

IMPLEMENTATION findings showed that:

- Utilization of PIRC services by parents and school personnel greatly increased.
- PIRC served a high need (low income, minority, LEP) and statewide population.
- PIRC greatly increased parental opportunity to learn about public school choice supplemental educational services and school accountability.
- PIRC services and resources received high quality ratings by school personnel and parents.

OUTCOME findings showed that:

- Partner schools/LEAs and community-based organizations have utilized PIRC technical assistance, services and activities to improve their parental involvement, policies, programs and activities.
- Disadvantaged preschool children and parents served by PIRC early childhood parent education contractors have improved their readiness for school.
- Communication and partnerships among parents, schools/LEAs and community agencies have improved.





The Chandler Education Foundation (CEF) has supported excellence in education for over 20 years. One of the core programs CEF is very proud of is the VISION:CollegeBound (VCB) Scholarship Program. Since 1999, CEF has awarded over \$1 million in scholarship funding to qualifying VCB Scholars. In addition, the community has received the benefit of over 167,400 hours of community service donated by our VCB students. According to the Arizona Independent Sector, this volunteer time can be valued at over \$3 million.


Though this program has had a significant impact on our students and community, the economic challenges of today and decline in nonprofit giving have forced CEF to reduce the financial benefit to the VCB Scholar. Though the scholarship amount has been reduced, there continues to be advantages for the VCB Scholar:

- Our CEF Team continues to promote VCB Scholars to our Arizona colleges and universities.
- A Letter of Recommendation is provided to all qualifying VCB Scholars from the CEF Board of Directors.
- Additional private scholarships are available through CEF and VCB Scholars are encouraged to apply.
- Each qualifying VCB Scholar is honored during the annual CEF Recognition Reception and during their senior graduation ceremony.
- The VCB Scholar's commitment to good grades, attendance, and community service continues to benefit them as they go through college and pursue their career.

Thank you to our VCB Scholars for giving back to our community. Thank you to our community and to our donors for supporting this outstanding program. To our parents and students, thank you for your understanding during these challenging economic times. We look forward to brighter days ahead.

VISION: COLLEGEBOUND SCHOLAR ~ CLASS OF 2000, MORGAN BETHELL-WEHNER



Morgan Bethell-Wehner is a VISION:CollegeBound Scholar from the Class of 2000. She is a Chandler native, an Erie Eagle, Jacobson Jet, Bogle Bulldog, and a Chandler High Wolf. After high school, Morgan graduated with a Bachelors in Pre-law from ASU and her Masters in Education from NAU.

One of the key things with the VISION:CollegeBound Scholars program is **service**. Had it not been for this component Morgan may have never been introduced to the Child Crisis Center in the East Valley where many foster children live in wait of a good foster home.

"It was an eye opening experience," states Morgan. "After my community service experience, I knew being a foster parent would be important to me someday, despite our 'healthy fertility'. In 2007, my husband and I took in two children, a 12 month old and 24 month old, both classified developmentally delayed. In 2009 we took in their 18 month old brother who is on a feeding tube and also developmentally delayed. This summer we added their 8 year old sister and in 22 months, we have grown to a family of six!"

Morgan goes on to share about her professional life. "After being a teacher for Tempe schools, in 2008 I opened my own business, the Kumon Math and Reading Center at Chandler Blvd and Gilbert Road, just a short distance from my alma-mater. I employ three high school students, all of whom attend Chandler schools."

Morgan's message to us today is this: "Well rounded students, produce well rounded adults. They may not all come back to Chandler like I did. But many will. Many will open small businesses which help the local economy. Many will do an act of service that benefits a child. Many will step up and become teachers, mentors, and community leaders. All of this benefits the community! Programs of the Chandler Education Foundation (CEF) like the VISION:CollegeBound Scholars program, helps our students develop into well rounded adults who give back to their community. To CEF we owe a debt of gratitude. We thank you...and our children thank you, too!"
