ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

ACP-Oakland VEX Robotics Teams A, C, and P, won their state championship competitions.

Basha High Future Farmers of America won their nursery/landscape, floriculture, and wildlife team state competitions.

Chandler High Future Farmers of America won the State FFA Milk Quality Career Development Event. **The Agricultural Business Management Team** also won first place at their state competition.

Miranda Vega and Natasha Zimmerman from **ACP-Erie** won 1st Place in the Division II AZ State Speech and Debate Tournament.

CUSD Students took home almost half (47%) of the state's Arizona Science and Engineering Fair Grand Awards. Five students from **Hamilton High** and three from **Basha High** also won Best of Fair for the Senior Division.

Erin Broas, Troy Gilchrist from **ACP-Erie** and **Lakshmi Laasya Vallabhaneni** from **Hamilton High** were chosen by the Flinn Foundation to be Flinn Scholars.

Elke Fajut and **Kimberlyn Knight** from **CHS** earned 1st place in Collage and 3rd place in Photography at the Congressional Art Competition.

Hamilton High's "We the People" Team placed 12th nationally, besting their 15th place ranking from last year in the National We the People competition.

Hamilton High's Academic Decathlon Team placed second in the nation in the online nationals. They also garnered 16 individual medals in various categories.

Ryan Elementary sixth grader **Alexandra Adams** won the Sun Lakes Lions International Peace Poster State competition.

At the prestigious 2018 International Science and Engineering Fair, **Nikita Bharati** of **Basha High** won 4th place out of nearly 2,000 participants in the Chemical Energy category. **Elda Bengu** and **Shreya Tripathi** from **Hamilton High** also won the ASU New American University Intel ISEF Scholarship. **Nikita** also won the third place Algae Biomass Young Researcher Award at the Algae Biomass Summit 2018, ranking among a Duke University graduate student and a Los Alamos National Laboratory post-baccalaureate researcher.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation named **38 students from CUSD** as finalists.

CUSD Schools received 26 A's, 12 B's and 4 C's from Arizona's State Board of Education, 20 of which were improvements over the previous year.

The Chandler Chamber of Commerce awarded **CHS** Assistant Principal **Karen Martin** the 2018 Administrator of the Year award, **Anne Marie Filiere** from **ACP-Oakland** the 2018 Educator of the Year award and bus driver **Alex Ruiz** the Support Staff of the Year award.

ACP-Erie science teacher **Rachna Nath** was awarded the Lemelson-MIT Excite Award.

CUSD ranked as the top school district in the Phoenix area by Niche.com. CUSD was also one of only three districts in the state to receive an overall "A" grade based on academics, teachers, clubs, activities, diversity, college prep, health, and safety.

All CUSD high schools earned an "A" grade and were ranked in the top 50 schools in Arizona. All 41 CUSD schools that were graded earned either an A+, A, A-, B+ or B grade, and 63% of those were an A+ or A.

ACP-Erie was recently named the top public high school in Arizona by MSN.com.

Amy Komitzky Henning of **CHS** was named as an Arizona Educational Foundation Ambassadors for Excellence semifinalist.

CUSD's Education Television and Community Relations Program this year won four Rocky Mountain Emmy awards from the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences.

Chandler High captured its third straight 6A state football championship.

The **Casteel High Girls Soccer Team** captured its first title by winning the Arizona 3A soccer championship.

The **Santan Junior High Cheer Team** won the U.S.A. Championship in the "Show Cheer Advanced" category.

The **Hamilton High Varsity Cheerleaders** won 1st place in the All Girl division at the Arizona State Cheerleading/Pom Tournament.

The **Hamilton Dance Company** became five time State Champions in the Varsity Jazz division, and placed 2nd in the Varsity Hip Hop division.

Casteel Pom won the AIA State Championship in the Division III Pom category. They also won first place in the same category at the 2018 State Cheerleading and Pom Tournament.

The **Puma Girls Beach Volleyball Team** captured Perry High School's second team championship of the year bringing home the beach volleyball state title.

The **Casteel High Boys Track Team** won their first state title, bringing home the Division III state trophy.

The **Chandler High Girls Track Team** won the 2018 Division I state championship. They have won 12 of the last 13 state titles.

The **Perry High Girls Badminton Team** won its second athletic team championship.

Chandler Online Academy student **Camden Pulkinen** won gold at the National Junior Ice Skating Championships.

In wrestling, **Ramon Ramos** of Casteel wrapped up a 51-0 season by winning the individual wrestling championship Div. IV title, **Yousuf Halik** of ACP Erie was the champion of Div IV, and Chandler High's **Zach Espalin** and **Gator Groves** won Div I state championships.

CHS sophomores **Nathaniel Deasey** and **Zachary Espalin** gained All-American status wrestling at the Freestyle National Tournament.

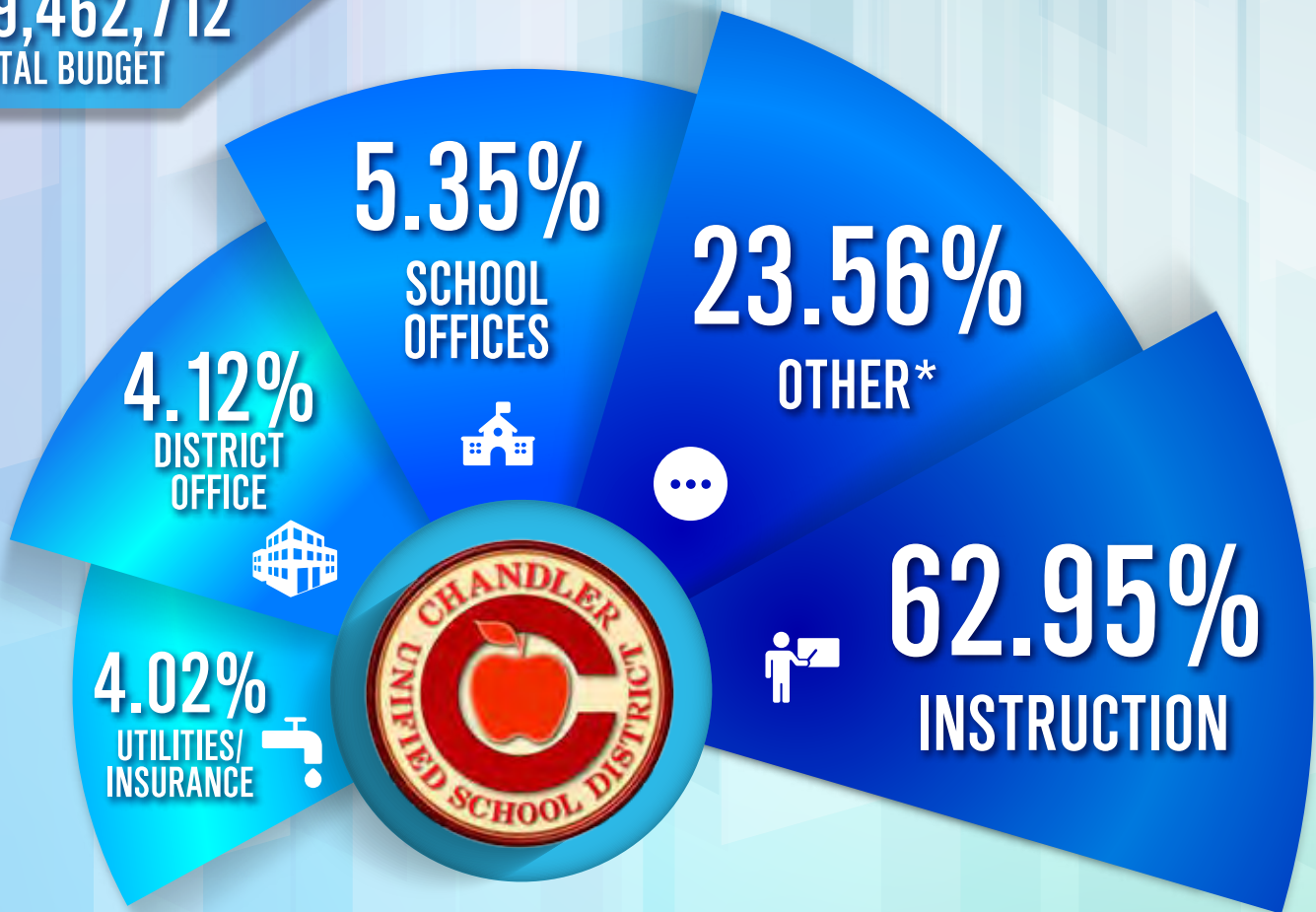

FINANCIALS

This year, Chandler Unified has once again ranked No. 1 among Arizona's large districts in the percentage of funds spent in the classroom, according to The Arizona Auditor General. CUSD continues to lead the way in efficiency which allows us to focus on the students, and it shows in our attendance rates, graduation rates, and state assessment passing percentages in all three categories consistently outperforming our peer group and state-wide averages.

CUSD LEADERSHIP

SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Camille Casteel has dedicated her professional career to the success of Chandler schools. Beginning as a first grade teacher, she advanced to become the first principal of Weinberg Elementary, and then associate superintendent, before being appointed Superintendent in 1996. Since then, she has led CUSD through its greatest period of growth and expansion, all the while improving and increasing partnerships with key advocates, community groups, municipalities, and businesses.

Dr. Casteel is a former Arizona Superintendent of the Year, Tech-Savvy Superintendent and Chandler Education Foundation Woman of Greatness, as well as recipient of leadership awards from the Si Se Puede Foundation, Chandler Chamber of Commerce, Tribune Newspapers, and East Valley Partnership. In 2014, the Arizona School Administrators (ASA) Association honored her with the Dr. Raymond Sterling Kellis Leadership Award. In 2015, the Governing Board voted to name the newest high school in her honor. She also received the Diversity Award from the Chandler Chamber of Commerce and was recognized in 2016 as the Extraordinary Superintendent of the Year by the Maricopa County Education Service Agency.



GOVERNING BOARD

Governing board members are elected by the public, serving four-year terms. The board sets all district policies and has final authority over all district business. The public is welcome to attend Governing Board business meetings and study sessions, generally held on the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month at 7 p.m. Study sessions are held as needed.

The district relies on the vision and stability provided by the Governing Board. Their 10-year plan titled Journey 2025 provides the vision for CUSD to be the top district in the nation. Metrics are established annually in the categories of Outstanding Students, World-Class Employees, Organizational Culture and Effective Resource Management.



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
