


# Sixth Grade Curriculum Night



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# Curriculum

- Students will continue to utilize the Journeys reading program.
- Students will utilize the Glencoe math program.
  - Your student will have a consumable math book (soft cover) that they will write in. There are two volumes for this curriculum.
  - Your student will have access to online materials to support the math program.
  - Your student will continue to use the website Reflex Math to practice math facts.
- Sixth grade will take part in a new character education program focusing on leadership.

# Rotating Classes

- Your student will switch classes for the following subjects:
  - Reading
  - Math
- Your student will stay in their homeroom for Writing and Social Studies/Science.
- You received contact information last week for the teachers your student has each day.
- In order to stay organized, students will be responsible for recording homework, upcoming tests, and project dates in their agendas.

# Study Skills

- Sixth grade students will work very hard to develop effective study skills so they can be prepared for junior high.
- Students will use notes taken in class in addition to study guides (when applicable) to prepare for assessments.
- Assessments in the areas of math, grammar, vocabulary, social studies, and science will not be open book.
- Students will be given the opportunity to make up tests they earn below a 70% on **for the first semester only**.
  - Students will have a maximum of 3 school days to complete and return their corrected tests.
- Studying should be an ongoing process – we do not recommend waiting until the night before assessments to prepare.
