The Community

The City of Chandler is located in the southeastern part of Maricopa County, approximately 20 miles from Phoenix. One of the fastest growing communities in the nation, the population of Chandler is currently over 247,000. The economic base in Chandler is diversified. Chandler has a strong economic base including manufacturing, electronics, financial institutions and biosciences. Major companies such as Intel, Paypal, Wells Fargo Corporate Headquarters, Microchip, Orbital Sciences and Charles Schwab maintain facilities in Chandler. The population is young and well educated with 70% of adults having some college education.

The School

Chandler High School, established in 1914, with three in its first graduating class, is a four-year (grades 9-12) comprehensive high school located in the heart of downtown Chandler. Chandler High was the first in Arizona to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program and our graduates are recognized and recruited at leading universities across the country. Chandler High School offers comprehensive fine arts and athletic programs, and a wide variety of extracurricular activities.

The Curriculum

The academic program is organized on a modified block schedule. A full course load is six credits. On Mon., Tues. & Fri. students have all six classes for 57 minutes. On Wed. students have periods 1-3-5 and on Thurs. students have periods 2-4-6 for 107 minutes.

International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement Programs

Chandler High School Honors Programs are structured around the rigorous International Baccalaureate (IB) Program and the Advanced Placement (AP) curriculum. CHS is one of only three schools in the state of Arizona with a full four-year IB program: the Middle Years Program (MYP) is for 9th and 10th grade students in at least one honors class, and the Diploma Program (DP) is for 11th and 12th grade students that complete honors level work in the six core areas of English, World Language, Math, Science, History and Fine Arts. IB students are well-rounded in academics, service to the community and activities such as clubs and sports. The students at CHS also have the option to earn college credit through the AP courses which overlap with the IB courses. Additional AP courses are offered in U.S. History, Human Geography, Comparative Government, Environmental Science and Music Theory. Our IB and AP teachers are well-trained and ready to help the students face the challenges of these rigorous college-level courses.
