The Curriculum

International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement Programs

Chandler High School Honors Programs are

structured around the rigorous International Baccalaureate (IB) Program and the Advanced Placement (AP) curriculum. CHS is one of only three schools in the state of Arizona with a full four-year IB program: the Middle Years Program (MYP) is for 9th and 10th grade students in at least one honors class, and the Diploma Program (DP) is for 11th and 12th grade students that complete honors level work in the six core areas of English, World Language, Math, Science, History and Fine Arts. IB students are well-rounded in academics, service to the community and activities such as clubs and sports. The students at CHS also have the option to earn college credit through the AP courses which overlap with the IB courses. Additional AP courses are offered in U.S. History, Human Geography, Comparative Government, Environmental Science and Music Theory. Our IB and AP teachers are well-trained and ready to help the students face the challenges of these rigorous college-level courses.

National Merit Scholarship Program

Nationally, CHS is recognized for academic excellence. CHS consistently produces National Merit Finalists as well as National Recognition recipients per year as well as Flinn Scholars.

Dual Enrollment

Dual Enrollment provides students an opportunity to take classes that they will not need to repeat when in college. Classes are offered through Chandler Gilbert Community College and they have transfer partnerships with all of the instate universities.
