Our School

Arizona College Preparatory opened its doors in 2007 becoming Chandler Unified School District's first secondary school-of-choice offering students a safe and personalized touch to learning. This year, Arizona College Prep is enrolling students in grades 8 through 12. Arizona College Preparatory is consistently ranked among the best high schools in the nation by U.S. News & World Report and the Washington Post as well as the state of Arizona.

Founded on academic rigor and strong discipline, students receive the personalized education that many families yearn for and some students need in a smaller academic setting. Students can look forward to dedicated instruction from Highly Qualified Teachers who specialize and are certified in the subject area they teach. The school's foundation was developed through the hard work and passion of students, teachers, parents and community representatives.

Our District

Chandler Unified School District consists of twenty-six elementary schools, including five traditional schools, eight junior high schools, and six high schools. The total student population is over 44,500. The U.S. Department of Education has recognized many of the schools in the district as National Schools of Excellence and Niche ranked CUSD the #1 district in the Phoenix area. The Chandler Unified School District has many partnerships with local companies that provide technology, internship and teacher training. There are more than 4,600 people employed in the school district. Students are transported by a central bus system.

Our Community

The City of Chandler, Arizona was founded in 1912 and incorporated in 1920. Since its early beginnings, Chandler has been a vibrant, diverse community. Chandler is located in the southeastern part of Maricopa County, approximately 20 miles from Phoenix. With a current population of over 250,000, it is one of the fastest growing urban centers in the nation. Chandler is quickly becoming a leader in high-technology. Our bio-science industry is also making significant strides as our newest pursuit. A city of opportunity, Chandler is proud of the increasing presence and commitment of quality employers such as NXP Semiconductors, Microchip Technology, Northrup Grumman, Avnet, General Motors, PayPal, FedEx and Intel Corporation. Our Curriculum

Students will be introduced to a rigorous, college-prep curriculum at Arizona College Preparatory. All 8th grade students at Arizona College Preparatory enroll in honors level math, English and social studies classes as well as accelerated science classes. Other 8th grade classes include high school level foreign language and elective classes include participation in fine arts and practical art courses as well as PE. High school students take primarily all honors and/or AP courses throughout their high school career. Numerous elective choices are available for high school students. Athletes participating on an official school varsity team are required to take Athletic Locker, a class for which students receive PE credit.

A small academic setting, coupled with personalized instruction, teacher support, high academic standards, and strict discipline sets a foundation for our students' academic and personal success in the classroom and in their professional lives.
