Arizona College Prep enrolls students in grades 9 through 12. Arizona College Preparatory is consistently ranked among the best high schools in the nation by U.S. News & World Report, The Washington Post, the state of Arizona and was recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School in 2019.

Founded on academic rigor and strong discipline, students receive the personalized education that many families yearn for and some students need in a smaller academic setting. Students can look forward to dedicated instruction from Highly Qualified Teachers who specialize and are certified in the subject area they teach. The school's foundation was developed through the hard work and passion of students, teachers, parents, and community representatives.

Our District

Chandler Unified School District consists of thirty-one elementary schools, including, ten middle school programs, six high schools and three alternative schools. The total student population is over 46,338. The U.S. Department of Education has recognized many of the schools in the district as National Schools of Excellence and Niche ranked CUSD the #1 district in the Phoenix area. The Chandler Unified School District has many partnerships with local companies that provide technology, internship, and teacher training. There are more than 4,600 people employed in the school district. Students are transported by a central bus system.

Our Community

The City of Chandler, Arizona was founded in 1912 and incorporated in 1920. Since its early beginnings, Chandler has been a vibrant, diverse community. Chandler is located in the southeastern part of Maricopa County, approximately 20 miles from Phoenix. With a current population of over 250,000, it is one of the fastest growing urban centers in the nation. Chandler is quickly becoming a leader in high technology. Our bioscience industry is also making significant strides as our newest pursuit. Our Curriculum

Arizona College Preparatory students have the opportunity to participate in a rigorous curriculum. Students are encouraged to enroll in honors level math, English, and social studies classes as well as accelerated science classes. Other classes include foreign language and elective classes, participation in fine arts and practical art courses as well as Career and Technical Education classes. Students take primarily all honors and/or AP courses throughout their high school career. Numerous elective choices are available for students in all grades. Athletes participating on an official school varsity team are required to take Athletic Locker, a class for which students receive physical education credit.

A small academic setting, coupled with personalized instruction, teacher support, high academic standards, and strict discipline sets a foundation for our students' academic and personal success in the classroom and in their professional lives.
