





Please refrain from sending in any snacks that contain peanuts, due to possible peanut allergies.


Also, per school policy, no red or orange drinks are permitted.


Behavior

Homework Folder




Morning Drop Off


- *Bus tags -go on backpacks (these are in your child's "catch up" folder)

*Coins: count and add



*leveled books to fit each individual learner


2nd Grade Goals
