## COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

Throughout the year, we will be learning the skills needed to apply critical thinking skills in reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

Every student will be expected to make authentic, real world applications to the texts we read, and learn to recognize and ideally, come to appreciate the value of all genres of literature. We will acquire skills and strategies to increase their comprehension, while they continue to extend and refine their knowledge about major literary concepts. There will be a variety of writing activities and assignments throughout the year, each of which is designed to expand the current writing skills students already have.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

We will:

- respond to a text by employing personal experiences and critical analysis
- control language by applying the conventions of Standard English in writing and speaking
- evaluate the content, organization, and language use of texts

**UNITS:** This course is separated into four major units. Ideally, they will be completed during each of the four quarters of the school year. Each unit will include short stories, articles, discussions, and poetry.

- 1. Memoir
- 2. Informational Texts
- 3. Historical Fiction
- 4. Science Fiction

**TEXTS:** Students will be reading one large text for most units. These texts are the novels your student will read.

- The Outsiders
- Castle
- Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry (7th only)
- A Midsummer Night's Dream (Honors only)
- Short Stories

### **DAILY CLASS PROCEDURE:**

You must be in your seat by the bell. Get out your materials. Record your homework in your agenda. Make sure that your phone is OFF. Hang your backpack on your chair. Follow the instructions on the board. At the end of class, stay in your seat! The bell does not dismiss you from class, I do.

#### **GRADING:**

Grading will be done based on weighting. **Weights for Each Assignment:** 

- •Classwork 35%
  - daily assignments, small activities, etc.
- •Homework 15%
  - official homework, small at-home practices or notes
- •Assessments 50%
  - tests, quizzes, papers, projects, etc.

#### **MAKE-UP WORK POLICY:**

Students will be required to keep track of their absences. You will have the exact number of days you missed to complete your make-up work. For example, if you missed one week, you will have one week from the day you get back to complete an assignment and turn it in. It is YOUR responsibility to ask questions, and complete and turn in your work. You must print your own make-up work from the website.

**Tests and Quizzes:** You have one week to make-up a test or quiz before it becomes a zero. You must come see me to schedule a make-up time.

## **REQUIRED MATERIALS:**

It is up to the teacher's discretion to accept any late work or to allow students to make up assignments. Late projects and papers will have 20% deducted for each day they are late.
