

# AP Calculus BC

**Supplemental supplies:** Students will need a graphing calculator (TI-84 preferred), and a spiral, composition, OR 3-ring notebook for Calculus notes and assignments **ONLY**.

## **Chandler Gilbert Community College credit:**

Students may choose to enroll for college credit for Calculus I (1<sup>st</sup> semester) and Calculus II (2<sup>nd</sup> semester) through Chandler Gilbert Community College. You will enroll in both semesters now, but payment for the Spring semester will not be due until then. The course numbers are as follows:

Calculus I – MAT 221 – Section #14586, Calculus II – MAT 231 – Section #17858

## **AP credit:**

For this class you will take the Calculus BC Exam. A student who gets a 4 or 5 on the BC exam will receive credit for Calculus I and II, and a 3 will get you credit for Calculus I only.

## **Attendance Policy:**

## **Grading Policy:**

- Tests and quizzes will be worth 90% of the cumulative quarter grade.

- The grading scale is 90-80-70-60, and grades are updated weekly on Infinite Campus.

- Semester grades are calculated with the two quarters counting for 80%, the final worth 20%.

- Each day I will provide a lesson, and students are expected to take notes and ask questions.
- You will have a printed assignment sheet for each chapter.
- Check my Perry website and classroom whiteboard for a calendar of dates for assignments.
- If you are absent, you can see what you missed from the assignment sheet and Perry website.
- There will be extensive AP review in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and throughout the year.
