Course Description

Band is open to any student who desires to learn a wind, brass or percussion instrument and read musical notation. At full CTA schools, band is offered before the school day during a 45-minute block so that students will not miss regular classroom instruction, PE, general music, or technology class. Class begins at 7:10 AM and ends at 7:55 AM. For beginners, the first band class is on at 7:10 on the morning of Monday, July 29th. For Advanced students, the first band class is at 7:10 on Tuesday, July 30th.

In class, the students will receive instruction in proper technique, posture, note and rhythm reading, tone, intonation, dynamics, and ensemble playing in a group performance setting. Band is also a class designed to help build self-esteem, cooperation, self-motivation, and life skills through the study of your chosen instrument. Band, like any other subject in school needs reinforcement. Students are expected to take instruments home on a regular basis to practice the skills and techniques learned in class. <u>As a reminder, Band</u> is a year-long commitment.

Course Materials

<u>Method Books</u> - These books may be purchased at most local music stores or ordered through online retailers. Please be sure to purchase the correct book for your child's instrument.

Instrument Supplies

All instruments require supplies in order to be maintained and performed correctly. Most of the supplies listed below can be purchased as part of your instrument's "cleaning kit" at any music store. Please bring this list with you to the store so that you can be sure that you are purchasing the correct items.

<u>Flute</u> - Flexible cleaning brush, tuning/cleaning rod, cleaning cloth.

<u>Clarinet and Saxophone</u>- Swab, cork grease, mouthpiece brush, reed guard, 5 reeds (Beginning students use #1 ½ reeds, returning students use #2 ½ reeds)

<u>Trumpet, French Horn and Baritone</u> - Valve oil (*rotor oil for french horn*), slide grease, flexible cleaning snake brush, mouthpiece brush, cleaning cloth.

Trombone - Slide oil, slide grease, flexible cleaning snake brush, mouthpiece brush, cleaning cloth.

<u>Percussion</u> – one pair of hard rubber or soft plastic tipped mallets, one pair of 5A drum sticks (mallets and sticks should come with your bell kit)

Course Schedule

Band at CTA schools begins at 7:10 AM. Students should arrive no earlier than 7:05. Band is held in the music room, and students should gather and enter at the exterior door of the music room by the main entrance of the school. Once on campus and in the band class, students may not leave to do other tasks on campus other than using the restroom. Students will be dismissed from band to their classes at 7:55.

<u>Beginning Band</u> meets on Mondays, Wednesdays, and every other Friday* and is for 5th or 6th grade students who are just beginning to learn a band instrument.

<u>Advanced Band</u> meets on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and every other Friday* and is for any student who has one year of prior band experience, or any student who wishes to audition for the more challenging ensemble.

Course Objectives

- Demonstrate knowledge/skills in independent playing and knowledge of how to play as a group.
- Be able to perform music individually and as a member of a group according to varying levels.
- Experience the feeling of success through individual and group efforts.
- Gain a higher appreciation for different styles of music.

Concert Attire

Males: Boys should plan to wear nice dress pants, a button up shirt and nice dress shoes if available. Ties are a nice addition, but are not required. Any color scheme is acceptable as long as it is not distracting.

Females: Girls should wear either a knee length skirt or dress, or pants with a blouse. Any color scheme is acceptable as long as it is not a distraction. Please follow all other school dress code requirements.

Grading Policies

Grading in band is divided into two categories: Content and Skills, and Behavior and Participation. Students will be assessed based on the following:

CONTENT AND SKILLS

Meets Standards: The student mastered most of the knowledge and skill areas assessed during

the semester. (MS) 80 - 100%

Progressing: The student mastered some of the knowledge and skill areas assessed

during the semester and/or shows evidence of developing understanding or skills. (P)

60-79%

Area of Concern: The student was unable to master the knowledge and skill areas assessed during

the semester and/or shows little evidence of developing understanding or skills. (AC) 0-

59%

BEHAVIOR AND PARTICIPATION

Excellent: The student consistently demonstrates willing and active participation and

consistently applies the Behaviors That Promote Learning (BTPL)* in the classroom. (E)

80-100%

Satisfactory: The student usually demonstrates willing and active participation and is

usually consistent in the application of the BTPL in the classroom. (S) 60-79%

Improving: The student is demonstrating willing and active participation on a more regular basis

and is more consistent in the application of the BTPL in the classroom. (I)

Needs Improvement: The student demonstrates a lack of active participation on a regular basis and is

inconsistent or acts counter to the application of BTPL in the classroom. (N) 0-59%

Content and Skills Grading

Playing Tests and In-Class Observation – 70%

- Students in band are required to demonstrate their growth and proficiency through a variety of
 methods. Students are monitored for progress throughout the year on a general basis in class,
 however students will be required to demonstrate their skill to me at least once per quarter through
 formal playing assessments. Playing assessments will be done through the Smartmusic online
 platform, or in person as needed.
- Students who do not demonstrate proficiency through their playing tests are offered targeted suggestions for improvement, and given more chances to re-submit their performance after further practice. Feedback will always be positive and encouraging for the students!

Written Quizzes - 30%

Students will be asked to complete short quizzes and formative assessments throughout the year as a
means of monitoring progress in areas of music literacy, technique, musical vocabulary, and other
standards-based areas.

Behavior and Participation Grading

Participation – 40%

- Bring instrument to every band class. After three class periods of not having instrument, the student
 will be issued a band participation/behavior reflection form to complete and their grade will go down
 one letter grade for the quarter. Please use the band calendar in your binder to keep track of when
 you need your instrument.
- Bring classroom materials every day, including <u>book</u> and <u>pencils</u>
- Demonstrating regular consistent practice routines through the *Smartmusic* platform. Students should be averaging about 10-15 minutes of practice per night, or around 50-90 minutes of practice per week.
- Come to class with a positive attitude, ready to learn and give your best effort.
- Attendance: Be in assigned seat with instrument, book, and pencil out, ready to play by the time the setup timer has expired.
- Be personally responsible for your setup (chair, stand, instrument) and cleanup each class.

Concerts/Performances - 40%

- Concerts make up such a high percentage of the student's grade due to the fact that band is a group activity. An absence from a performance affects the whole group. In addition, students work extremely hard bringing musical pieces up to a performance standard. For this reason, they deserve a chance to display their efforts and talents.
- If it is not possible for the student to perform in the concert, contact from a parent/guardian in advance is required in order for the student to be given a make-up excuse. In order for a student to be considered excused, it needs to be regarding family emergencies, illness, acts of God, etc... Failure to plan is not an excusable reason. Students are given calendar dates the first week of school in order to plan accordingly.
- In cases such as emergencies or sudden illness where prior notification is impossible, a parent or guardian must contact Mr. Abrahamson as soon as possible. The student will be given one week after the concert to turn in the assignment.

Behavior – 20%

- Students are expected to treat all members of our groups with respect, kindness, and fairness.
- All school rules will be enforced per the student handbook and CUSD guidelines.
- Bullying CUSD has a zero tolerance policy for bullying.
- Excessive talking during class, or playing an instrument out of turn to intentionally disrupt a lessons is taken seriously. Students who are choosing to cause disruptions in rehearsal will be warned and redirected in class. Students who do not correct their behavior will be issued a reflection form and lose points from their behavior grade.
- Students can earn back points for their behavior grade by demonstrating excellent behavior in the future.

Smartmusic

Smartmusic is an online platform that provides a powerful array of tools and resources for music students. Each student will create their own free Smartmusic account and will use Smartmusic to guide their practice at home. As a teacher, I will be able to monitor student practice as well as assess student progress through playing tests. Smartmusic requires the use of a laptop, desktop or Chromebook computer with a microphone. Smatmusic also has an app for the iPad. Students who do not have access to these forms of technology will be required to complete paper practice records instead and will be given the option of completing playing tests in person with me. Band Belts and Awards

Each quarter, band students will have the opportunity to earn a "belt" (ribbon) by demonstrating their progress and proficiency on their instrument.

- Similar to the traditional karate belt system, the band belt system is designed to encourage and
 motivate students to grow and learn and to develop a sense of pride from those who have met the
 challenges of learning and instrument.
- Any student that fails to pass a playing test will be given the opportunity to continue their practice and re-test until they earn their belt.
- In addition to the belts, students will also be able to earn special Musicianship, Leadership and Perseverance pins by accomplishing various activities and tasks such as volunteering, attending concerts, performing solos, collaborating with peers, etc...
- Students who earn their belts on time each quarter will be treated to a party with Mr. Abrahamson. 6th graders who end their year with the Black Belt will earn a special reward party!

Contacting Me: As a traveling teacher the best form of communication with me is via email. My email address is abrahamson.luke@cusd80.com

Staying in Touch With You: I will generally use two methods to keep in touch with parents throughout the year. Most often, I will stay in touch with parents using the Remind app. This allows me to send quick info, including attachments and links, in the form of a text to your phone. I will also be using the messaging feature within Infinite Campus (*please make sure your email is up to date*), as an extra measure for reaching everyone.

Signing up for REMIND: In order to receive regular information about your child's band class, please sign up for the REMIND app. Detailed directions are available on our website, however you can easily sign up by finding your child's class, and texting the corresponding code.

Obtaining an instrument:

- I would highly encourage you to rent your instruments through any local music store. It might seem enticing to buy a cheap instrument from an online retailer, but often times these instruments are of poor quality and can break often. If they do not break or have problems, the students often struggle to play them because of their poor build quality.
- The best way to find a shop to rent from is by talking to friends and neighbors, or by using your favorite search engine via the internet and search for local instrument rentals.
- CUSD Instruments: We never want money to be the reason a student cannot play an instrument. If you are experiencing financial hardship, CUSD has an instrument rental program. There is a small fee at the beginning of the year, if you qualify and are selected your student can use a district instrument for the whole year.
 - o <u>If you are interested in a low cost CUSD instrument, CUSD rental information is due to Mr.</u>
 Abrahamson before the end of class on Friday, July 26th. No exceptions. Applications will be sent home on Wednesday, July 23rd. Please email Mr. Abrahamson if you need an extra copy.

Make an investment!

- Please be involved in your child's learning. Just like any of the other courses your student's take in the classroom, concepts taught must be reinforced via activity in the classroom and homework at home. The same applies for learning an instrument. Learning to play a musical instrument is challenging at times, and your child will need encouragement and insistence from you to push past the hard work. I expect students to practice on average somewhere between 60 and 90 minutes per week. Practice is monitored through Smartmusic.
- Make practice fun! Be involved with their practice; make it fun by having your student perform mini impromptu concerts for you, where they can play a song they learned in class that day.
