# **August Family Challenge**

This month we are focusing on teamwork. Your family is your most important team. The August Family Challenge is to create a Family Mission Statement. Work as a team to create a mission statement using the steps below.

### Step 1: Ask yourself these seven questions:

How do we want our family to be known?

How do we want to treat each other? What is most important to us as a family?

What are some of our talents, gifts, and abilities?

What makes us the happiest?

What makes us unhappy?

What kind of home do we want to invite friends to? Step 2. Write your Family Mission Statement.

Consider all four areas: • Body (health and physical welfare) • Brain (learning) • Heart (relationships) • Spirit (inspiration) Keep it simple, one to two lines, so the youngest family members can memorize it and find it meaningful. Examples: "We are builders," "No empty chairs," "To serve others," "All for one and one for all."

#### Step 3. Stay on course.

Keep smiling and getting back on track. By writing a Family Mission Statement, the message is that your family is important-you know what you stand for and how you are going to work together to accomplish it.
