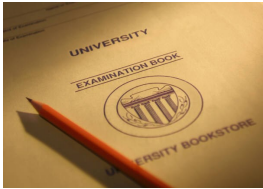


Mission Statement

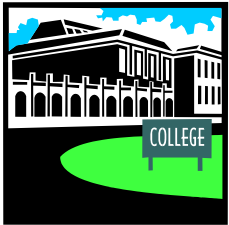

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Dual Credit is an opportunity for eligible high school students to earn lower division college credit during regular school hours at their high school.



Earn College Credit while attending high school

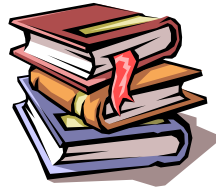
Dual enrollment courses allow students to earn both high school and college credit for the same class. The credit earned may be used to complete an Associates degree at the approved partner community college. This is currently MCC/CGCC.

Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- Helps students plan for college
- Experience college level courses
- Curriculum approved by Maricopa Community College
- Enhances higher level cognitive skills
- Saves money on college tuition
- Provides incentive to advance beyond high school

Advanced Placement Students who enter this program undertake a rigorous and challenging academic course of study taught at the college level.

Each Advanced Placement course may require 4-8 hours of independent work per week, entailing research, writing, reading and independent study. Students must have the ability to organize, prioritize and utilize time management.

- Possible college credit with exam grades of 3,4, or 5
- Cover subjects in greater depth
- Build skills for college work
- Enhance resume for college
- Investment towards college cost
- Improve self confidence

Are You Considering Honors/Dual Enrollment/AP Classes?

- Establish short and long term academic goals
- Be informed about prospective courses
- Establish a time management system that will accommodate classes, extra-curricular demands, athletics, family commitments, jobs, etc.
- Commit to courses that fit your needs and willing to meet their requirements
- Follow through and be prepared for success

CLEP, or College Level Examination Program, is a national program of credit by examination that allows a student to obtain recognition for college level achievement. Select high school courses prepare the student to earn college credit through the CLEP program. Contact individual colleges for their CLEP policy.

CLEP offers two types of tests:

*Check with counselor to schedule exam

- General examination: measures the familiarity with material covered in courses taken the first two years in college
- Subject examination: measures
