

## Phonogram and Spelling Activity Ideas

Written phonograms and spelling should be written at least once a week. This is a list of ideas for other ways to practice. If you choose to do one of these for homework, please note that on the practice page to receive credit.

- Writing in shaving cream, rice, salt, sugar, etc
  - Spellingcity.com
- Roll out play dough and make phonograms/spelling words
- Write on large chart paper, chalk board, dry erase board, etc.
  - Rainbow phonograms/spelling
    - Oral practice
    - Typing phonograms/spelling
  - Paint phonograms/words with water on a chalkboard
  - Spell words with magnet letters, scrabble squares, etc
- Q-tip eraser: parents write the phonograms/words on a whiteboard or chalkboard. Students use q-tip to erase as they spell them.
  - Alphabet stamps
- Sandpaper practice: students trace phonograms/words on a piece of sandpaper
- Pyramid spelling. Write each spelling word adding one letter at a time. Ex: c, ca, cat
