TEAMS COMPETITION

Chandler High took three teams to the TEAMS (Test of Engineering Aptitude, Mathematics and Science) competition at ASU Polytechnic Campus before spring break. Students were divided into groups of 8 and had three tasks: 1) write an essay on how to adapt a building in the community to make it more energy efficient; 2) answer 80 multiple choice questions involving math, science, and engineering prompts; and 3) build a tower out of straws, pipe cleaners, and paper clips. They were charged with building the tallest tower, in the shortest time, which could hold a tennis ball. After the first day of scoring, one of CHS's teams placed **FIRST!**





ASU LANGUAGE FAIR

CHS World Language students competed in the ASU International Language Fair in March. CHS's German program, led by Frau Mello, won 1st place in the German Novice Prepared Recitation and 1st in the German Intermediate Known Play. 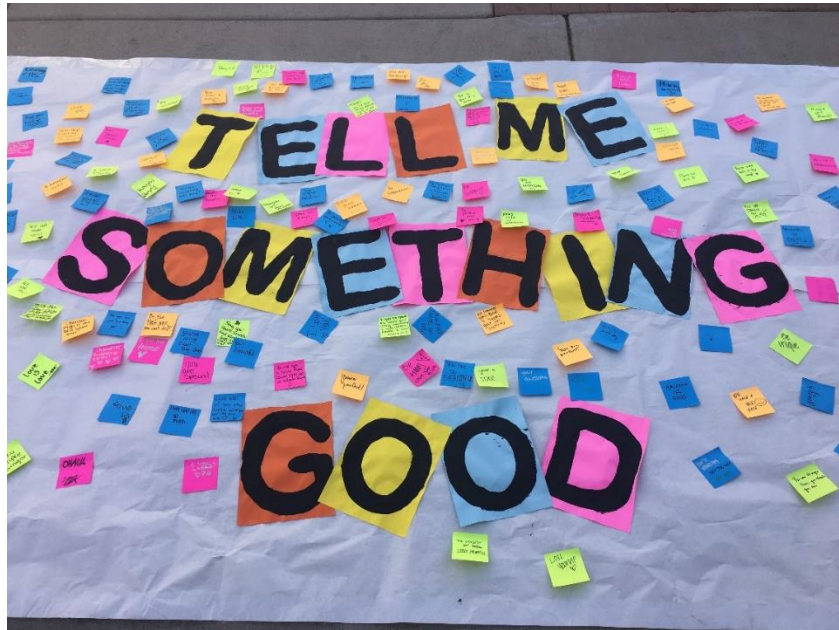
the “Oh Say Can you Seed,” and how bees communicate with “Show Me the Honey.” Pictured is Chandra Andazola at Galveston Elementary School.



DISABILITIES AWARENESS WEEK WRAP-UP

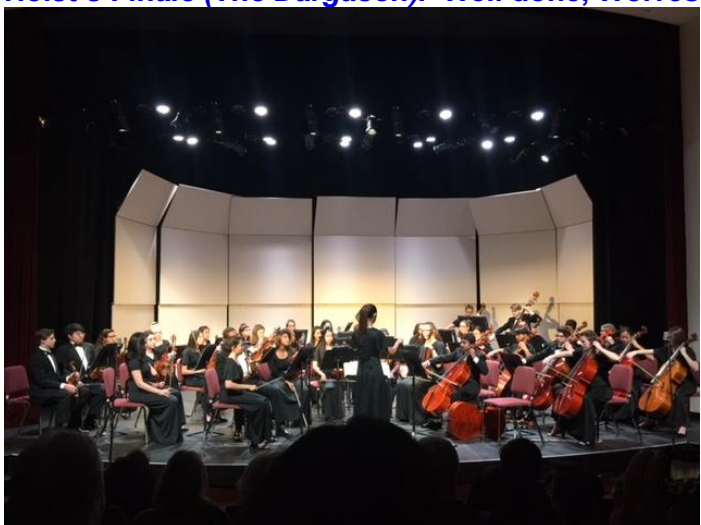
