


CHS WELCOMES GERMAN STUDENTS


APRIL 11TH IB MYP PERSONAL PROJECT SHOWCASE






There is no commitment to register for classes if your plans change in the fall, but applying now allows you to determine your eligibility and become pre-qualified for funding.

All testing begins at 7:25am. There will be no zero hour on testing days. We are running two bus routes each day of testing, the regular route for testers, and a second route for non-testers. Students not testing AZMERIT or AIMS Science will catch their bus 3 hours later than regularly scheduled pick-up. On April 24th, freshmen, sophomores and seniors will catch their bus 4 hours later than regularly scheduled pick-up.


