Counselors from EMPACT and QCHS will be available to meet with parents and community members following the presentation.

Presenters:

Jill McMahon is a licensed professional counselor, specializing in working with families bereaved by suicide. Jill oversees EMPACT-SPC's Survivors of Suicide support groups and is the clinical lead for the Local Outreach to Suicide Survivors (L.O.S.S.) Team. Mrs. McMahon has been a part of the EMPACT prevention team since 2007.

Renée Ouellet is an MSW and works as a Prevention Specialist for EMPACT-SPC, a non-profit community agency in Maricopa County. Ms. Ouellet has been the lead facilitator for mental health screening programs, such as Signs of Suicide, for over seven years.

Steve Schiro is a retired educator and former Chapter Chairman for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) in Arizona. Steve currently facilitates suicide prevention presentations with EMPACT staff in Maricopa County. Mr. Schiro became involved in suicide prevention work after losing his son to suicide.
