# **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

#### Grades 9-12 Full year, 1 credit

This course addresses the physical, social, emotional, and mental development of the child. Parental, caregiver, and occupational roles in early childhood professions will be examined. Students interact with children in the on-campus childcare center. **Course Fee: \$10 due 8/2 (date may change).**

# **MATERIALS REQUIRED:**

Students are expected to come to class with paper, pen, <u>composition book or 80 page spiral notebook college rule</u>, and **pencil & pen** every day to take notes as needed. All other supplies and materials will be provided to you through your fee.

### **ACTIVE PARTICIPATION:**

Students are required to actively participate in class. Participation means completing all assignments (textbook, written, group and oral), maintaining a notebook, and getting involved in group/class discussions, group activities, and participating in childcare lab experiences. In addition, students will be conducting self-evaluations and peer-evaluations, responding to films and guest speakers, and preparing for tests and quizzes.

#### MAKE-UP WORK:
