Course Objectives/Competencies:

The Common Core State Standards are designed to be robust and relevant to the real world, reflecting the knowledge and skills that our young people need for success in college and careers. Students will be intellectually challenged; they will read *Beowulf, Canterbury Tales, Hamlet* or *Macbeth* and, *The Stranger*, as well as countless short stories, poems and non-fiction essays. We will develop skills such as literary analysis, language and grammar, synthesis and research, argumentative writing, test preparation skills and some creative writing.

Materials: The following items are <u>required</u> for this class:

- 1. FIVE different colored highlighters Pink, Green, Blue, Orange, and Yellow
- 2. ONE college ruled composition books
- 3. Loose Leaf College Ruled Paper
- 4. Blue/Black Pens /#2 Pencils
- 5. A folder/section of a binder for this course only.

Grading:

This is not a weighted class. Grades will be based on a point system with each kind of assignment being assigned the following point values:

- ★ Formative Assessments (40%)
 - Discussion/Participation (40-50 points)
 - In-Class assignments (40-50 points)
 - Individual/group projects (100+ points)
 - Informal Writing Assignments (50-70 points)
 - Homework (10-20 points)

- ★ Summative Assessments (60%)
 - Unit Tests (100+ points)
 - Formal Writing Assignments (200+ points)

Missing Work:

Missing work is considered a ZERO and will be calculated as such in the grade book. However, when an assignment is marked as missing in the gradebook, I will add a comment indicating the amount of time you have to turn in an assignment, usually corresponding with the Late Work policy below.

Work not fully completed at the pre-determined due date will be considered an incomplete and, therefore, missing.

Late Work:

Late work will be accepted per the CCHS Grading Policy, and deducted 10% from the grade earned for each day late. Please fill in and attach our class late slip to the front of the assignment. Work that is more than TEN school days late will not be accepted.

Make-up Work:

You are allotted the number of days that you were absent, plus one, to make up your work. It is your responsibility to complete the work on your own time. Check my website or the absent box when you return for missed work. Make-up work will only be accepted for excused absences.

Absences that fall in the middle or near the end of a major project will not impact an individual's due date for the project, assuming the absence is less than 1/3 of the total project timeline.

Extra Credit:

Extra credit may be given at the end of the semester; only students who have successfully completed ALL assignments may take advantage of extra-credit opportunities, as it is offered as enrichment beyond what is already expected.

Cell Phones/Electronic Devices:

Cell phones must only be used for classroom purposes. Surge protectors are available for charging, but only if the phone is plugged in before the final bell rings. There will be many times when phones will be used for class activities – if this is the case, it will be communicated clearly before class begins. Ongoing or repeated offenses will result in disciplinary action including lunch detention or administration referral.

Plagiarism

Plagiarism is a serious offense that will be treated as such. Any work turned in that is not your own, even if only parts of it are not your own, regardless of where you received the information, **will receive a zero**. Repeated offenses will be referred for administrative discipline. It is up to all of us to maintain the integrity of the classroom.

Self-plagiarism is a form of cheating and is academically dishonest. It occurs when an author reuses his/her own previously written work or data in a 'new' written product without letting the reader/instructor know that this material has appeared elsewhere. This includes reusing any portion of an assignment previously written and/or submitted to an instructor for a grade and/or an assessment. Any act of self-plagiarism, intentional or unintentional, or acts of academic misconduct on any assignment, may result in: failure for the assignment, or failure for the course after a conduct referral has been written.

Conduct: Behavior of becoming a mature, young adult is expected.

Be Appropriate – You are old enough to know what behavior and language is appropriate. You will be expected to keep hands and feet to yourself and refrain from <u>all</u> foul language, racial slurs and backtalk. In other words, my classroom is rated G.




