- -A. Angel Island- San Francisco bayimmigration station where many Asian immigrants had to pass through.
- -(Between 1910 and 1940, as many as 175,000 Chinese immigrants were detained and processed at Angel Island.)

Chinese immigration

- B. Chinese jobs-
 - 1. came over in search of California gold
- 2. Many became workers on the transcontinental railroad, including dangerous jobs such as dynamite blasting
 - 3. Opened up laundry businesses
 - 4. Set up Chinatowns

Chinese immigration

- C. Racism and discrimination faced by Chinese
- Nativism-belief which is against foreign immigration and foreign influence.
- 2. Chinese Exclusion Act (1882)-
- a. law which banned Chinese workers from entering the U.S. for 10 years.
 - b. Chinese already in the U.S. were refused citizenship
 - c. Law was reauthorized for many years after this in different ways to limit Chinese immigration
