- I. Background of the movement
 - A. Was also called The Age of Reason,
 - B. Lasted from approximately 1687-1789
- C. A movement of **philosophy** that took place in Europe and later in North America.
- D. Flowed out of the **Scientific Revolution** and caused people to want to use **reason** to understand the behavior of individuals and human **society**
 - E. Led by people known as **philosophes** or philosophers

- II. Major ideas of the Enlightenment
- A. Reason- People believed they could use their intellect to discover truth about humans and society.
- B. **Skepticism** They desired **proof** that something is true. They began to express suspicion toward rulers and the religious church at the time.
- C. Religious tolerance- they believed that people should be able to believe what they wanted without being treated badly
- D. Personal **liberty** of individuals. Humans had rights which could not be taken away by the government.
- E. Progress- they believed that humans were getting better all the time and causing advancement in society.
