- I. Workers organize
 - A. Workers faced a list of problems including...
 - 1. 10-12 hour days
 - 2. No sick days
 - 3. Unsafe and unhealthy working conditions
 - 4. Low pay
 - 5. Dull, repetitive jobs

The Labor movement

- B. Workers formed labor unions to negotiate with business owners for better working conditions.
- II. The AFL
- A. Samuel Gompers, a labor leader, founded a national organization of unions called the American Federation of Labor (1886)
- 1. They wanted to use collective bargaining (negotiations) to talk to employers about their demands.
 - 2. They sought by and large to avoid strikes.

The Labor movement

- B. Strikes were successful and sometimes they could turn deadly.
- C. The Homestead Strike (1892) turned violent, leaving multiple people dead.
