- ➡ I. The book- Uncle Tom's Cabin (best selling novel of the 19th century).
 - A. Written in 1852 by Harriet Beecher Stowe
- B. Described the story of challenges and suffering of multiple slaves in the United States
- 1. Reaction #1- Many in the North were shocked and outraged by the book's contents.
- 2. Reaction #2- Many in the South saw the book as lies and felt that slavery was not properly portrayed.
 - C. The book caused further division over the issue of slavery.

The impact of a book and a court decision

- II. The court decision- Dred Scott v. Sandford (1857)
- A. Dred Scott was a slave who was taken by his master to free territory, later returning to a slave state.
 - B. He sued for his freedom since he had been in a free state.
- C. The Supreme Court ruled against Scott 7-2 and shared the following:
- 1. Dred Scott had no rights to sue in court since slaves were not citizens.
- 2. The court said that the Missouri Compromise was unconstitutional since it was not allowing owners to take their property (slaves) into a territory.
- 3. Because of this court decision, slavery had the potential to expand with no laws against it.
