2. Hoovervilles- uncomplimentary name given to makeshift shacks set up by homeless during the Depression. Many times they were set up as shantytowns.

Onus Army- name given to thousands of veterans who wanted an early bonus payment for their World War I service and protested in Washington D.C.; their protest ended in disaster.
