

Setting Up Your Interactive Notebook

This is your notebook.

This is not your friend's or neighbor's notebook.

Notebook Checks:

You must have your notebook EVERY DAY. Notebooks will be checked periodically.

Lost Notebooks:

If you lose your notebook, replace it IMMEDIATELY. Ask Mrs. Lipinski for copies of foldables, if needed.

Absences:

You are responsible for getting notes from another student or from Mrs. Lipinski's website.

Respect The Notebook:

Complete assignments carefully, checking for accuracy.

No Pages Are Allowed To Be Torn Out:

Pages are not allowed to be torn out. If you mess up, paste a blank sheet of paper over that page and re-do it.

Doodling:

Adding illustrations, borders, or other creative designs is welcome, as long as it doesn't distract from the words on the page.

The Interactive Notebook:

- Allows you to process information to improve your understanding.
- Helps you learn new ideas by having you use several types of writing and graphics to record them.

Interactivity:

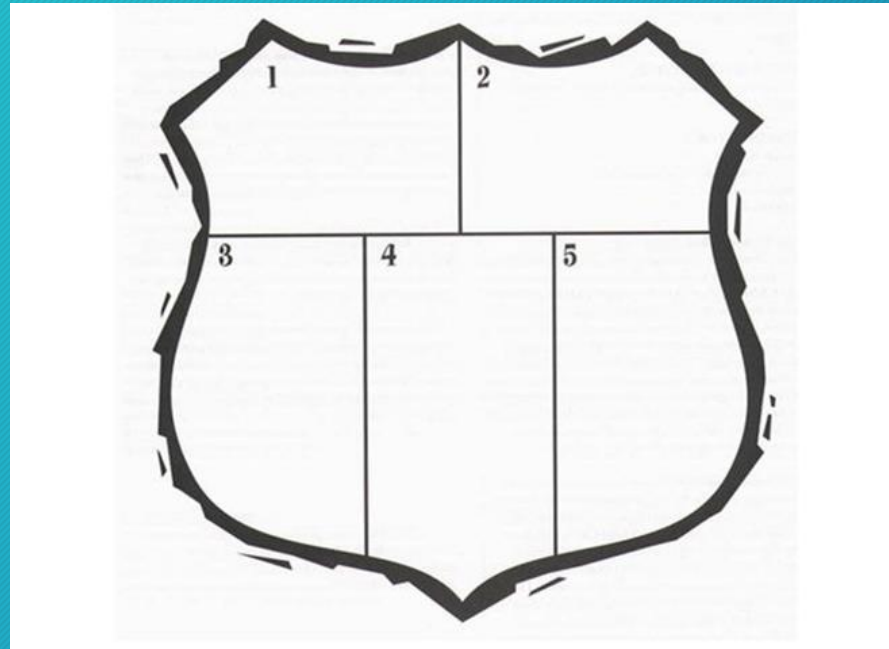
- Every page has a date and a page number.
- Ideas and relationships are highlighted or written in color.
- Activities are included to help understanding.
- Foldables and graphics are used to show relationships.

Why Are We Doing This:

- Writing notes does not mean you have learned the information. You must actively do something with information before you really understand it.
- It gives you permission to be playful and creative with your notes. When you are creative, you remember more.
- We cut and fold because foldables are amazing graphic organizers. They help take big ideas and break them down into manageable parts.
- We tape and glue organizers in so things don't get lost. Your notes aren't useful if you can't find them.
- We color because it's a great way to help important information stand out and to process information. Coloring and highlighting notes helps you to recall and find information.

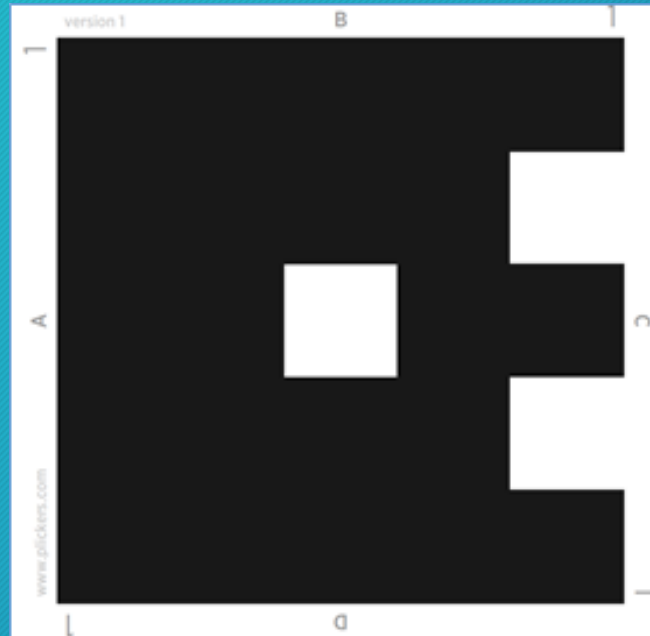
Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 1

- Complete your Coat of Arms. Cut it out and tape it (around ALL sides) onto the front cover of your notebook.



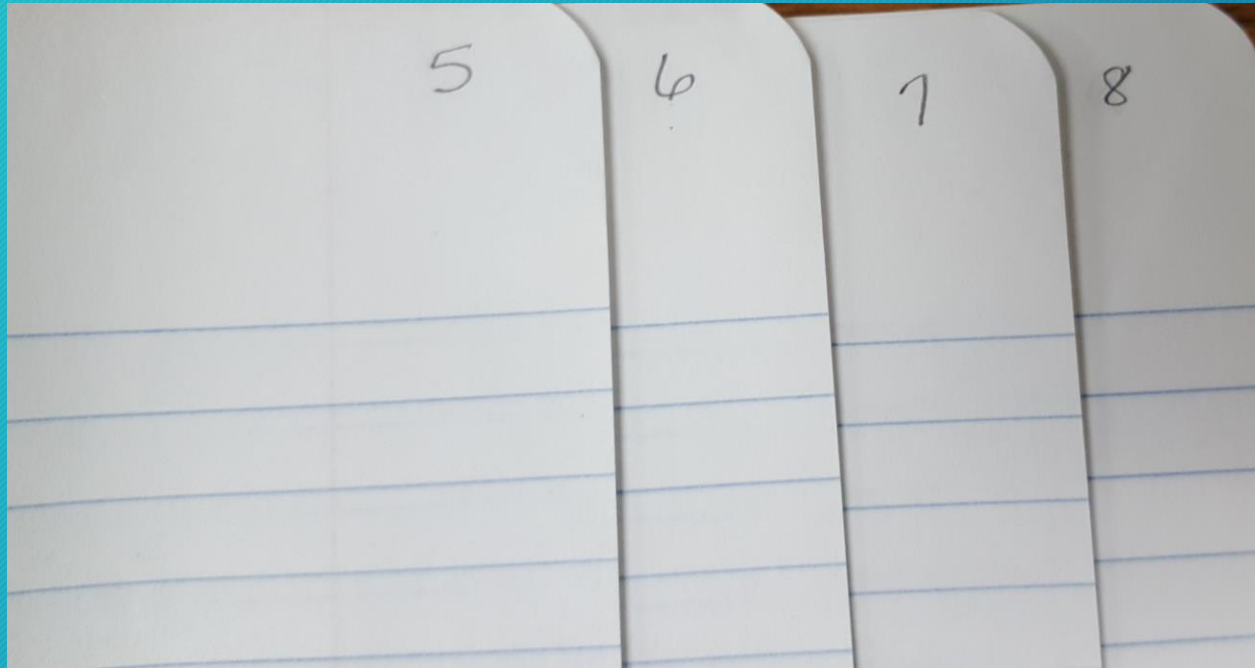
Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 2

- Add the Plicker to the inside of your front cover by taping or gluing it. The Plicker should be the same number that I gave you for your folders.




Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 3

- Number all of the pages starting with page 1, but ONLY on the right side of your notebook.



Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 4

- Starting on page 1, set up your Table of Contents, by giving it a title, a column for the date, and a column for the page number. Do this on the next two pages too.

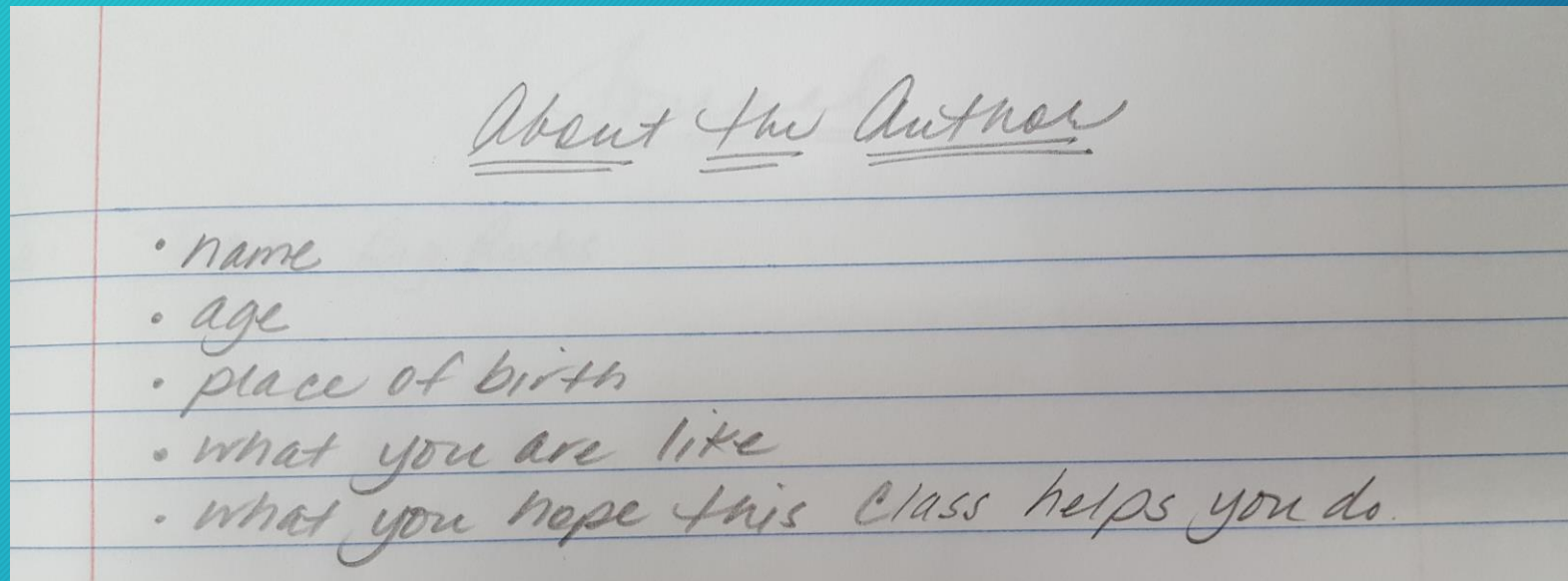

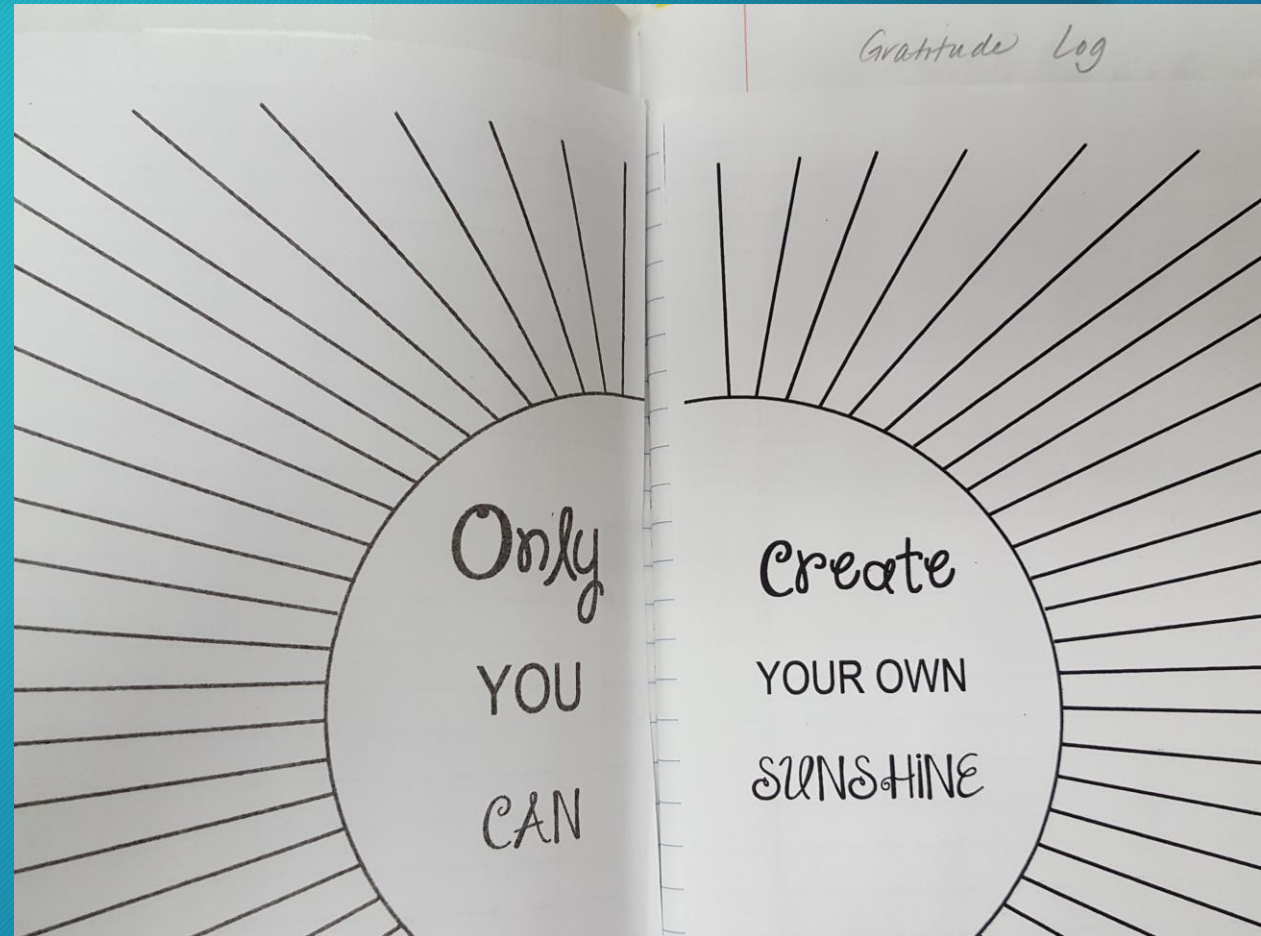
Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 6

- Create an All About Me page on the last page of your notebook. Include the following information in complete sentences. Add it to your Table of Contents (TOC) by dating the entry and giving it a page number.



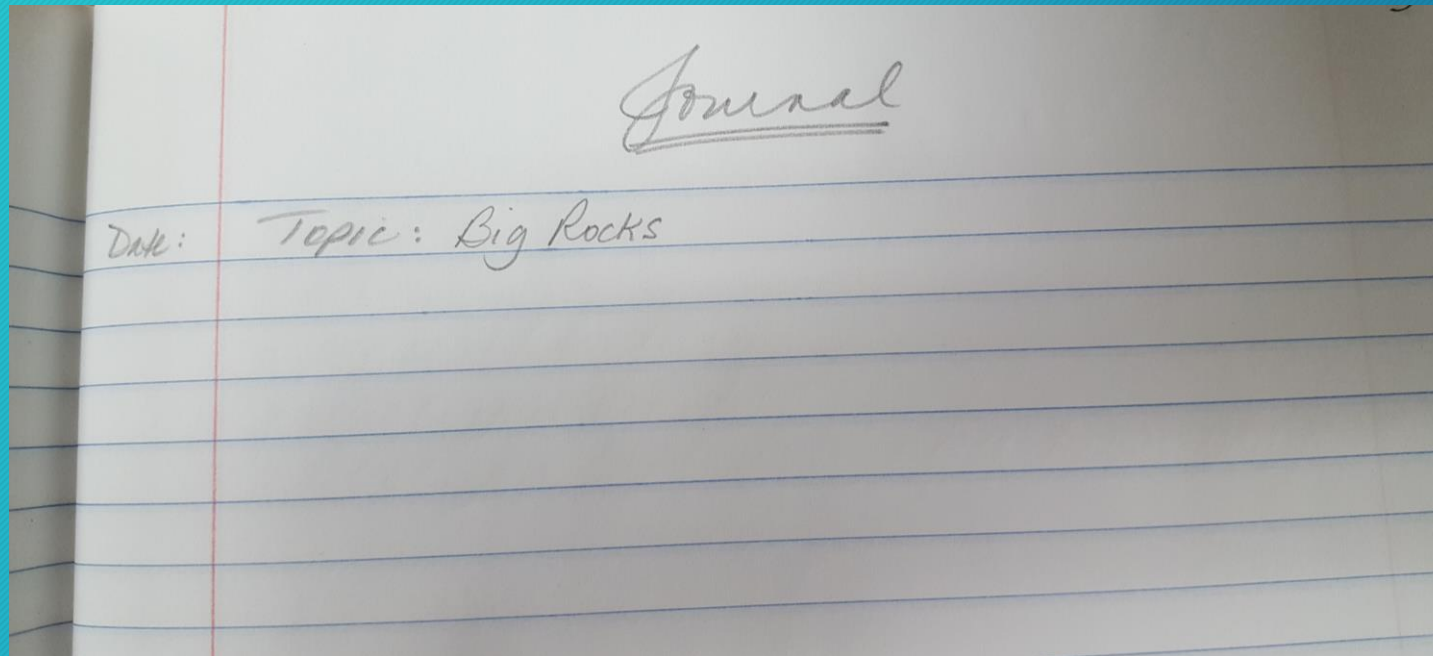
Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 7

- Your Gratitude Log is a place for you to express what you are grateful for on a daily basis. Two pages should create a complete sunburst for each quarter—You will begin on the left side of the page!



Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 8

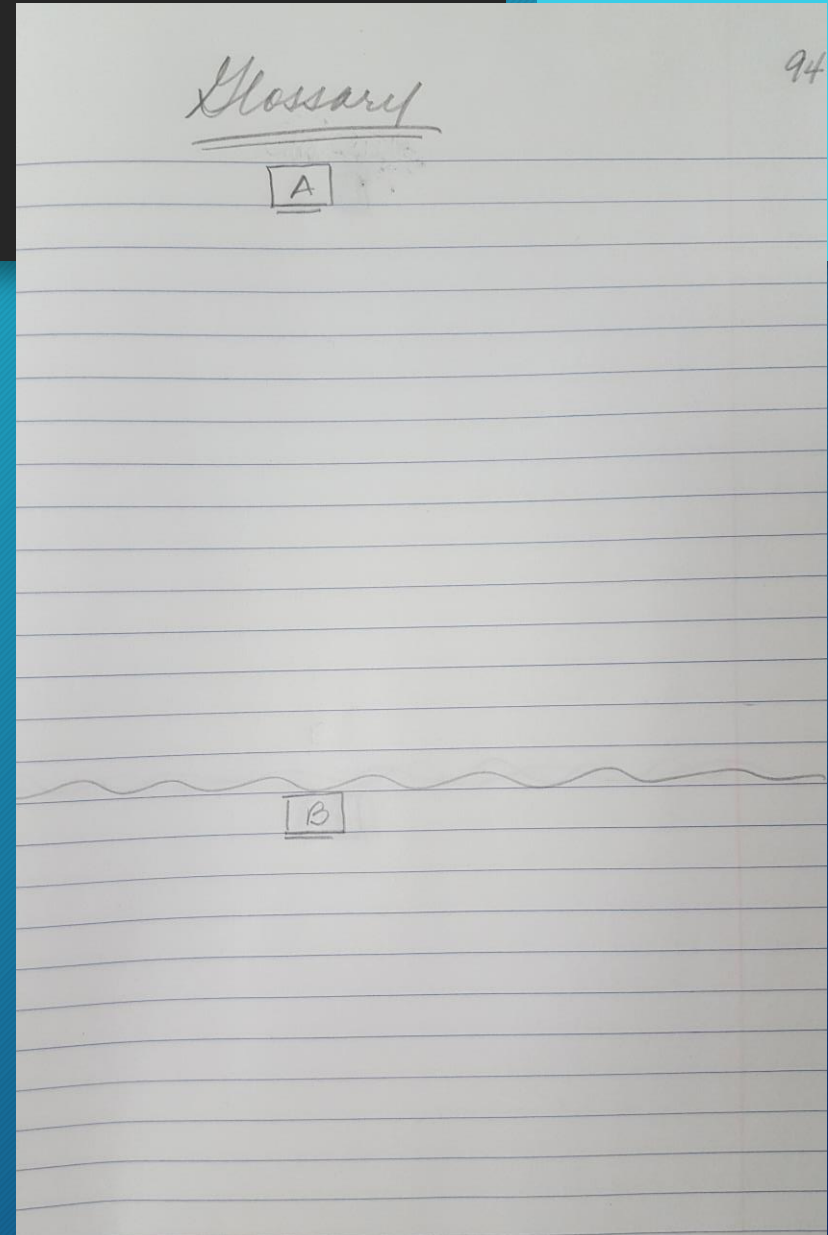
- On the page after your Gratitude Log, create a journal section by writing the title **Journal** at the top of the page.



Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 9

- Add a Glossary at the back of your notebook by counting 8-10 pages from back cover.
- Give it the title Glossary and add two letters per page.

Hint: You might want to give the letter P its own page! (You'll find out later!)

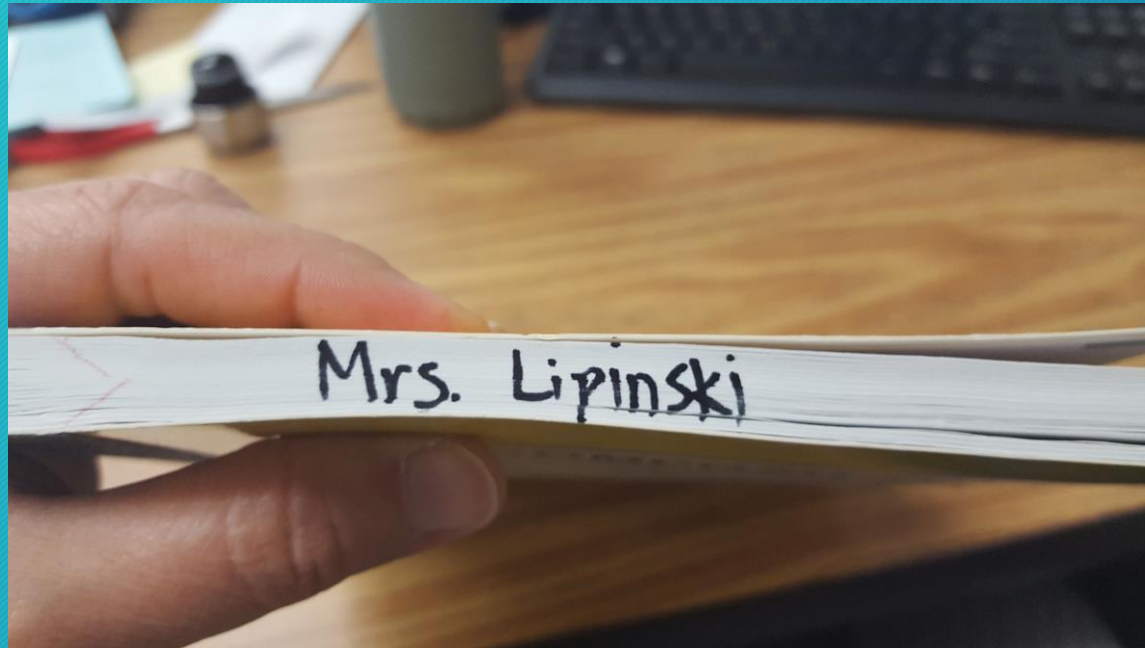


Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 10

- Add the Interactive Notebook Rubric on the back cover by:
 - cutting the sheet in half
 - writing in Quarter 3 and Quarter 4 at the top of the page in the space provided.
 - stapling or taping both sheets, one on top of the other, to the back cover.

Setting Up Your Notebook: Step 11

- With a marker, write your full name on the edges of your notebook: top, side and bottom.
