No Short Shorts



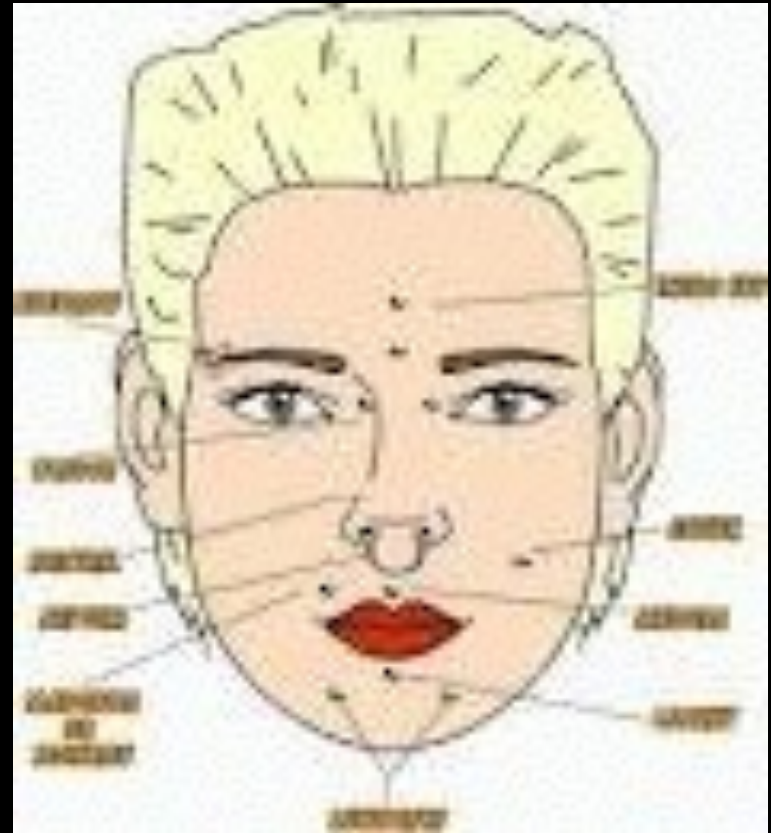
Acceptable Length Shorts

- Must not expose the hip or upper thigh
- Must not reveal under garments
- Be properly fitted

Generally, all shorts should have a 4" inseam and not be shorter than the thumb when the arm is fully extended at the side.

BJHS.**

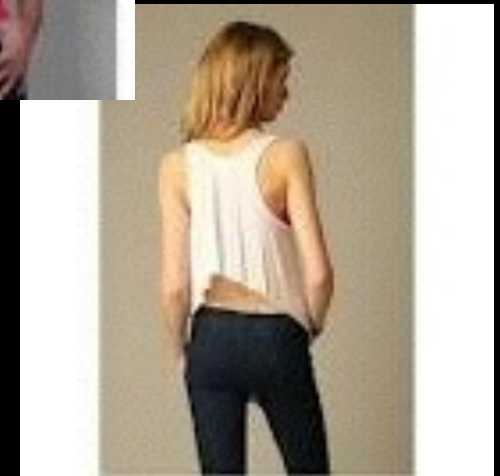


Acceptable Lace Tops
