Dual Enrollment Credit

- Dual Enrollment Credit opportunities will be available starting your Sophomore year.
- Dual Credit is an opportunity for eligible high school students to earn lower-division college credit during their regular high school classes. The credits are treated the same as regular college credit, and are transferable to other Maricopa Community Colleges, Arizona's states universities and many out-of-state colleges.

Key Points to Remember

- If you register for Algebra1/Honors Geometry Block or Honors Geometry/Honors Algebra2 Block, it will take up two full class periods.
- Math and Science courses are paired at Casteel.
- Athletic Academies: Football, Volleyball, Soccer, Basketball
 - Junior High and High School levels.
- Fall sports: Cross Country, Girls Volleyball, Boys & Girls Golf, Football, Swimming, Freshman Tennis, Spiritline
- 3 semesters of marching band, percussion, color/winter guard or JROTC count as 1 PE credit. Anything less is elective credit.
- If you have completed 8th grade foreign language at Casteel or 7th and 8th grade foreign language at Payne, you may sign up for the 2nd year of that language.

All registration is done via the Campus Portal of Infinite Campus. Students must log into the Campus Portal and register for courses. This worksheet is to prepare the students for this online registration. Students will turn this worksheet into the CCHS counselors.

- Students must select classes to fill six (6) periods.
- Students must provide at least two (2) alternate choice for electives.
- Students in need of Off Campus Release Time (Seminary) must indicate by filling in one of their electives. This will replace one elective and yield no credit toward graduation. They will need a zero hour class as it is mandatory to be enrolled in six (6) credit earning classes. Placement in zero hour classes is not guaranteed.
- Students may select optional zero hour classes in addition to the required six (6). Possible zero hour classes are listed on the back of this form. They will only be offered if there is adequate enrollment and / or teaching personnel available. Zero hour classes are not guaranteed. You must provide your own transportation for zero hour classes.

*Algebra 1/Honors Geo and Honors Geo/Honors Alg 2 are Block (2 period per day) classes where students receive credit for Algebra 1 or Honors Geometry during the fall semester and Honors Geometry or Honors Algebra 2 during the spring semester.

- Marching Band (7th Hour) and Jazz Band (Zero Hour) period classes. They meet before/after school. Students signing up for these courses must complete the entire chart above and sign up for six (6) periods throughout the school day.
- Students who sign up for Release Time (Seminary) must sign up for a 6th credit bearing class. Release Time is a non-earning course assigned during 1st through 6th periods. We recommend a zero hour or Chandler Online Academy.
