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Dear 3rd - 6th Grade Students and Parents,

Auxier Elementary is proud to offer our **Girls Who Code Club** starting in October for our 3rd- 6th grade students! The <u>Girls Who Code</u> program began seven years ago and has clubs in all 50 states. This amazing program is committed to closing the gender gap in technology fields. Here's why this is so important:

- Computer-related occupations are projected to increase 12.5% from 2014 to 2024 and will result in nearly half-million new jobs. (<u>BLS Study</u>)
- Today, there are over 500,000 open tech jobs and only 64,000 computer science graduates to fill them. Here in AZ, there are 9,301 jobs, with only 814 CS graduates. (Code.org)
- 1 in 5 computer science graduates are women and projections show that by 2027, only 22% of computing jobs will be held by women. (Girls Who Code)
- Only 32% of middle school girls are interested in or enrolled in computer science programs, down from 66% of girls in K-5. (<u>Girls Who Code</u>)

Our goal is to encourage and support girls who show an interest in computer science! Club meetings will be on Wednesday mornings from 7:45 AM to 8:30 AM in our Computer Lab B beginning on October 23. Students who join Girls Who Code at Auxier will focus on three major areas during our club meetings:

- 1. **Women in Tech**: Students will join a safe and supportive environment of peers as we spotlight women computer scientists and discover strong female role models in the field of technology.
- 2. **Code**: Students will explore basic to advanced programming concepts that form the basis of all programming languages.
- 3. **Impact**: Club members will work in teams to design and build a Computer Science (CS) Impact Project that works to solve real world problems they care about through code.

Our Girls Who Code club is free and open to all 3rd through 6th grade students who are interested in coding, making an impact in our community, and learning about women role models in the field of technology.
