
The Origins of <u>Hinduism and Buddhism</u> Chapter 3 #1



Hinduism

- Collection of religious beliefs developing in Asia.
- Use the Vedas
- Cannot be traced back to one founder with a single set of ideas
- See <u>religion</u> as a way of <u>liberating the soul</u> <u>from the illusions</u>, disappointments, and mistakes of everyday existence.









<u>Upanishads</u>

- Book of translated beliefs
- Explores how people can achieve liberation from desires and suffering
- Moksha state of perfect understanding of all things
- Atman- the individual soul of a living being = Brahman – world soul that contains and unites all atmans.
- Common belief that everything in the world is in the aspect of Brahman.
- Most don't achieve Moksha = Achieved = Reincarnation = Karma- good or bad deeds influences specific life circumstances



Hindu Religious <u>Practices</u>

- Worship temples, small villages, and at home. Individual worshipers might offer food, drink, or gifts to a god.
- Meditation Physical and mental exercise called yoga. Teaches people how to focus their bodies and minds which will aid to help them attain moksha.
- <u>Pilgrimage- Ganges River</u>, believe the water is holy, it will purify them, and remove bad karma.
- <u>Society</u>- where you are <u>born in society</u> came from good or bad karma earned in a former life.



<u>Buddhism</u>



- Developed in India
- One <u>founder Siddhartha Gautama</u> also <u>known as Buddha(enlightened one)</u>
- 29 years old Siddhartha spent his life searching for religious truth and an end to life's suffering.
- Wandered through the forests of India for six years seeking enlightenment.
- Journey debated with other religions, fasted (ate 6 grains of rice a day), and meditation.

<u>Teachings</u>

- Four Noble Truths = Enlightenment
- <u>Eightfold Path= Nirvana, release selfishness</u>






The 4 Noble Truths


- 1. Life is Suffering

Minoan Trading Ship Phoenician Trading Ship


Minoans


- Powerful seafaring people, dominated trade Eastern Mediterranean from 2000 to 1400 BC
- <u>Lived on Crete</u>, large island on the Aegean Sea.
- Produced the finest painted pottery, swords, figurines, and vessels of metals.
- Legend- King Minos owned a Minotaur, kept it in a labyrinth (complicated maze).
- People enjoyed boxing, wrestling, and bull leaping.



Minoans Culture

- People enjoyed boxing, wrestling, and bull leaping.
- <u>Women preformed religious ceremonies</u>. Higher rank than most early civilizations.
- Mother Earth Goddess ruled all the other gods of Crete.
- Egyptians through trade influenced the Minoans (writing, food, and religion).
- Civilization ends 1200 BC- volcano, tidal wave and ash.






Phoenicians'

Controlled modern day Lebanon.


• <u>Founded a number of city-states</u> that competed with each other.

• First to sail southern coast of Britain, and around Africa.



Phoenician Culture

- Traded red-purple dye (snail 60,000, 1lbs), papyrus, wine, weapons, metals, ivory, and slaves.
- Developed a system of writing that used symbols to represent sounds.
 Phonetic- one sign used for one sound.
- Word alphabet comes Phoenicians.
- Introduced writing system to trading partners.
- Expanded world trade routes. Egypt to Asia.
- Cities were captured by the Assyrians.




Canaan (KAY nuhn)

- Cultural crossroad. By land it connected Asia and Africa, by sea Mediterranean and Red Seas.
- Israelites settled Canaan
- Early history is contained in the <u>Hebrew Bible – Torah</u>



Founding

- God chose Abraham to be the "father" of the Jewish people.
- Abraham was a shepherd and God commanded him to move his people from Ur to Canaan 1800 BC.
- Descendants of Abraham moved to Egypt. Migrated back and forth for years. God watched over them.
- Monotheistic- God had power over all the people, not a physical being.
- <u>Israelites asked God for protection</u>, sacrifices for protection. <u>Mutual</u> <u>promise.</u>



Exodus

- Hebrew Bible says the Israelites migrated to Egypt, first given a place to honor Egyptian kingdom, later forced into slavery.
- <u>Israelites fled Egypt Exodus and they</u> remember this event every year during <u>Passover.</u> 600,000 people 40 years.
- <u>Prophet Moses led Israelites out of slavery.</u>
- Israelites were traveling across the Sinai Peninsula. <u>Moses</u> stop to pray and spoke with God. Brought down 2 stone tablets on which God had written the <u>Ten</u> Commandments.
- Basis for the civil and religious laws of Judaism.
- Judaism influenced Christianity and Islam.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Exodus 20:1-17


- Thou shall have no other gods before me.
- 2. Thou shall not make any graven images
- Thou shall not take the name of the Lord Thy God in vain.
 - Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.
 - 5. Honor thy Father and Mother
 - 6. Thou shall not kill
 - 7. Thou shall not commit adultery
 - 8. Thou shall not steal
 - 9. Thou shall not bear false witness
 - 10. Thou shall not covet

Kingdom of Israel

- Canaan- land that the Israelites
 believed had been promised to them by
 God.
- United Canaan under 3 kings and called the new kingdom Israel. <u>Built capital of</u> Jerusalem.
- Built a great temple to glorify God, contained the tablets of Moses' law.
- City feud over finances and labor.
 Divided in to two cites- Israel in the North, Judah in the south = where name of religion comes from.



Unification of China # 4




Geography Early Chinese Civilization

- Largest population of any civilization
- More than 50 ethic groups
- Yellow River 2,900 miles
- Yangtze River 3,400 miles empties to Yellow Sea
- Mountains and deserts isolated
 Chinese from other parts of Asia



Dynasty-a family of rulers who right to rule is passed on within the family




Invaders attack empire Bandits raid countryside

Confucian and social order 551 -479 B.C. Minister of Justice

- He <u>believed that social order</u>, <u>harmony</u>, and a good government <u>could restore China if there were 5</u> <u>basics</u>...
 - 1. ruler and subject
 - 2. father and son
 - 3. husband and wife
- 4. older brother and younger brother
 - 5. friend and friend

Spent his life teaching students about kindness and courtesy



Confucianism

Not a religion but an ethical practice based on right and wrong

Became foundation for Chinese government and social order

 Education is important both to the welfare of the individual and to society




- "There are three methods to gaining wisdom. The first is reflection, which is the highest. The second is limitation, which is the easiest. The third is experience, which is the bitterest."

Qin Dynasty- 221 B.C.


- Defeated invaders doubled the size of China
- Crushed those who resisted Chinese rule
- Strengthened military
- Burned "useless books" wrote by Confucian thinkers, murdered Confucian scholars
- Government had totally authority autocracy





Qin Dynasty- 221 B.C. Continued

- Centralization = built 4,000 miles of highway, standards for writing, law, and currency.
- Created irrigation systems for farm production
- Great Wall of China huge defensive wall, almost the length of the entire empire, built by peasants, worked for no wages, many labors died while building.
- Qin Dynasty unified China at the expense of human freedom



Great Wall Facts

- Stretches from the Yellow Sea in the east to the Gobi Desert in the West.
- Thousands of miles long
- Watch towers every 200 -300 yards
- Took millions of tons of stone, dirt and rubble to fill the core.
- Each section is 20-25 feet tall
- Took over 2,000 years to build
