Company/Performance Theatre Audition Packet

Thank you for your interest in Company Theatre! This class is a <u>year-long</u> theatre intensive that requires an audition and approval to be in the course. <u>Only students who are in grades 11-12 and are inducted thespians are eligible for Company Theatre.</u> Freshman interested in being in Company Theatre are encouraged to sign up for Jr. Company/Theatre III, which focuses on preparing students for Company through in-depth acting training.

The primary focus of Company Theatre is honing our performance skills through an individualized rehearsal process and script analysis. In this course, we will be analyzing and performing higher level plays, as well as practicing our playwriting and directing skills. This course is our highest-level acting group on campus. Assignments are rigorous; the class will require time outside of class. The ideal applicants are not only talented, but hard-working, driven, and reliable students who work well as members of an ensemble.

Students will participate in competitions and festivals, including:

- AZ Thespian Festival November *
- Hamilton District Festival December
- Central Arizona Festival for Theatre (CAFT) January *
- Nationals Summer 2022
 - Juniors are eligible to compete for scholarships at this event for a variety of colleges across the U.S.
- Other competitions/festivals TBD

There will be reqired after school performances in each semester, including:

- One Acts September/October (Date TBD) *
- Competition One Act Performance December *
- 24-Hour Play Festival February *
- Company Show May *
- Students must participate in both mainstage shows. If they are unable to do a tech crew or audition for a role, they must complete a certain number of hours in the scene shop.*

* indicates a mandatory performance/festival - it will be for a grade

The Audition

When: May 3, 2021. Auditions start at 3 pm

- 3:00-3:45: Group Acting
- 3:55-6:00: Solo Auditions

Where: Performing Arts Center

The audition will include:

- Two contrasting monologues, 1 minute each.
 - Must be from published plays
- Choice of:
 - o 30 seconds of Shakespeare
 - 30 seconds of musical theatre. Must provide track and if needed, an adapter.
- A short interview with the audition panel
- For your audition, dress in all black movement clothing.

Due by May 2 at 9 pm:

- Application for Company Theatre
 - Must sign in with GSE account (Google Classroom)
 - Includes written component
- New applicants: <u>Two recommendation forms</u> from <u>CORE</u> teachers. Please email them the link to complete the application.
- Returning applicants: Mrs. Pitner & another member of the audition panel will write your recommendations.

Sign up for your audition time here

There will be an audition panel to help with consultation, but ultimately Mrs. Pitner will be making the final decisions. Past performances and attitude/work ethic in previous fine arts courses and productions will be considered when making selections. Students must sign up for an audition slot in advance. We recommend that students arrive ten minutes before their slot. Approximately 12-16 students will be chosen to participate in the course. The list will be put on Mrs. Pitner's website by the end of the week of auditions. The list will then be provided to the counseling office so that schedules may be changed accordingly for next year. If you are not selected for Company Theatre, you will be placed in Jr. Company (Theatre III) for the year.
