

Thank you for your interest in *Fiddler on the Roof*. Below you will find audition and callback information. Auditions are Monday, January 13 and Tuesday, January 14 after school on the stage from 2:40-6:00.

Jr. High Students:

For this show, 7th grade students will **only** be considered for a role in the children's ensemble. 8th grade students will primarily be considered for roles in the ensemble. Your audition will focus on your ability to create a character while singing and dancing. You will only attend the dance/group audition on Monday. You do **NOT** need to do an individual audition. You will need to prepare:

- **completed audition application** (online will be posted over winter break)
- vocals for "Tradition" either the "daughters" or "sons" sections (find the Original Broadway Cast recording online)
- be comfortable with "To Life" this song will be used for the dance audition
- 7th Grade only: two letters of recommendation from CORE teachers or adult leaders
 - Recommendation forms for teachers to fill out are included in this packet. It is the student's
 responsibility to print the forms & bring them to their teachers. They must be returned to Mrs. Pitner
 prior to auditions please ask your teachers to place them in Mrs. Pitner's box. Jr. High students who
 arrive at auditions without these completed prior to auditions will not be able to audition.
- 8th Grade: If we are interested in seeing you for featured ensemble parts, we will hear you read for those roles at callbacks.

High School Students:

High school students will be considered for all roles and must attend both days of auditions. You will need to prepare:

- a 30-45 second monologue
- a 30-second (16 bar) song
 - o come prepared with a backing track (karaoke version). <u>This is required</u>. You can play this from your phone or other music device. We will provide a speaker. If your phone cannot be plugged into an aux cord, you are responsible for bringing your own Bluetooth speaker or adapter.
 - select a song from a Broadway show <u>do not do a pop song!</u> Pop music will not highlight your voice in the way that we need to hear it.
- completed audition application (online will be posted over winter break)
 - If you are most interested in a dancing/ensemble role please note this on your form and it will be considered during casting
- vocals for "Tradition" (find the Original Broadway Cast recording online)
 - Women be familiar with the "Mamas" and "Daughters" sections
 - o Men be familiar with the "Papas" and "Sons" sections
- **be comfortable with "To Life" –** will be used for the dance audition

There are two parts to the audition: the dance/group portion and the individual monologue/song audition. High School students must attend both to be considered for casting.

Audition Schedule

Monday, January 13

- 2:40-4:00: Jr. High Dance ("To Life")/Group Singing ("Tradition") Audition
 - Wear comfortable clothing that does not limit movement as well as proper footwear. No slippers, flip flops, or bare feet. Tennis shoes, character shoes, or dance shoes are preferred.
 - Remember that during this portion of the audition, we are looking to see if you tell the story through your dancing, not if you are the world's greatest dancer!
 - You will dancing to a portion of "To Life"; you can find the song online to become acquainted.
 - You will be singing through your selected part of "Tradition." Please be familiar with the
 Original Broadway Cast version of the song.
- 4:00-6:00: HS Dance/Group Auditions
 - See above for details.

Tuesday, January 14

• 2:40-6:00: High School Individual Auditions. See above for requirements. You must sign up for a slot on Mrs. Pitner's door.

Individual Auditions - High School

Individual monologue and song auditions will take place Tuesday from 2:40-6:00. You will need to sign up for an audition slot on Mrs. Pitner's door for your individual audition. Please select material that reflects the character you are auditioning for, as well as the genre of the show. You will perform your monologue and song for an audition panel consisting of the directors and other school personnel. If you do not know how to pick a monologue, do not worry – there is more information in the packet. You can also see Mrs. Pitner or Mrs. Clausen for additional help with selecting a monologue or song. On the day of your audition, bring homework to work on, snacks, and water to keep you hydrated and energized. Auditions may run late, so please plan accordingly. Please arrive for your audition at least ten minutes early. If you are not there for your audition time, we will be moving on.

Callbacks

The callback list will be posted on our Casteel Theatre Company website (http://cusd80.com/Page/85426) at 8 pm on January 14, as well as on Mrs. Pitner's door. Callbacks are Wednesday, January 15 and Thursday, January 16 from 2:40-7:30 onstage. If you are not asked to come back for callbacks, it does not mean you are not cast. We will post a list on Wednesday night of the people we would like to see again on Thursday. For callbacks, the production panel will be trying to fit people in roles. You will be asked to do acting and singing. You may also be asked to dance; come dressed accordingly. For the acting portion, you will be asked to do cold reads from the script. It will help you to do research into the show – what is the play about? Who are the characters? What are their relationships? The internet has a great deal of information about this show and the more information you have, the better prepared you will be for your audition. For the singing portion, you will find a list of callback songs on the CTC website. We recommend you review them prior to callbacks. You may be asked to perform multiple songs if we are considering you for multiple roles.

The cast list will be posted on our website by 8 pm on Friday, January 17. It will also be posted on Mrs. Pitner's door. Please sign the cast list on Monday if you accept your role in the show.

Rehearsal/Show Information

Rehearsals for *Fiddler* will be Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 3:00-5:30 pm. We have built in a time for students to do homework and seek tutoring from 2:30-3:00. Rehearsals will run longer as we get closer to show dates. Additionally, we may need to hold rehearsal on the Saturdays leading up to the show. If you are unable to attend rehearsals, this may not be the show for you. Please list any conflicts on your audition sheet. Conflicts do affect casting, and unexcused absences will not be tolerated because of the negative impact on the production and scheduling process. More than one unexcused absence or more than two excused absences may result in your termination from the show. An absence will be considered excused if your parent/guardian emails Mrs. Pitner prior to rehearsal, and the reason for your absence includes serious illness or a family emergency. Please avoid scheduling appointments during rehearsal times, as those will not be considered an excused absence. Any absences during dress/tech weeks will result in your removal from the show.

If cast, your parents/guardians will be asked to help. There are a variety of jobs that we need parent help for, including box office, providing dinner for dress rehearsals, assisting with tech, backstage help, and more! It means a lot to the students when their parents are involved, and it helps the directors out a TON!

Finally, all members of the cast and crew must pay the \$25 drama club fee in the bookstore. If you have already paid the fee this year, you are good to go! The fee is <u>nonrefundable</u> and will need to be paid in the bookstore no later than January 24. Failure to pay this fee will result in your termination from cast or crew unless prior arrangement have been made with Mrs. Pitner. Students (and parents!) can also purchase a show shirt for \$10 in the bookstore. This is optional, but a great way to show support for our show!

All cast and technicians will be expected to attend the first read-through on **January 22 from 2:30-5:30**. At each rehearsal, students are expected to bring water, snacks, and a pencil (or five!). Students are required to have a binder for their scripts that they bring to each rehearsal. Students are also required to follow the cast Remind and to sign up for the cast Schoology. You will receive more information about this if you are cast.

Our show has the honor of participating in the ASU Gammage High School Musical Theatre Awards on May 23, 2020. By auditioning for this show, you are agreeing to participate in the awards ceremony if one of your numbers is selected to perform. This will require additional rehearsals in May to prepare for the performance on the Gammage stage!! All cast is invited to attend the awards ceremony regardless of if your number is performing. This is a huge honor for our program and a super fun day – we look forward to participating! More information to come.

LEAD CHARACTER BREAKDOWN

TEVYE

The likeable, hard-working, pious dairyman who always try to see the positive side of life. He is a proud patriarch and father of five daughters, closely raised according to the old scriptures. Age: 45-60. Vocal part: Bass-Baritone.

GOLDE

Tevye's strong-willed wife who wishes for her daughters to have good husbands and live easier than she and Tevye. Age: 40-50. Vocal part: Mezzo-Soprano.

TZEITEL

Tevye's eldest daughter, who is madly in love with Motel. She is loyal to her family but typically challenges the town's traditions. Age: 18-25. Vocal part: Mezzo-Soprano.

HODEL

Tevye's second eldest daughter, who becomes involved with Perchik. Age: 18-23. Vocal part: Mezzo-Soprano.

CHAVA

Tevye's middle daughter who loves to read. Falls in love with a Russian soldier. Age: 15-20. Vocal part: Mezzo-Soprano

SHPRINTZE

Tevye's fourth eldest daughter who takes lessons at home from Perchik. Age: 9-13. Vocal part: Alto.

BIELKE

Tevye's youngest daughter. Takes lessons at home from Perchik. Age: 8-12. Vocal part: Alto.

YENTE

The meddling matchmaker. She is a widow and village busybody who knows all of the town gossip. Age: 50-60. Vocal part: Alto.

MOTEL

The poor and meek tailor who shares a deep love with Tzeitel. Sensitive and nervous, but sincere and friendly. Age: 18-25. Vocal part: Tenor.

PERCHIK

The outspoken student and visitor to Anatevka, who constantly challenges the traditions of the town. Eventually falls in love with Hodel. Age: 20-30. Vocal part: Tenor

LAZAR WOLF

The feisty, brawny butcher and the town's wealthiest citizen who wishes to marry Tzeitel. Age: 40-50. Vocal part: Baritone.

AVRAM

Runs the local bookshop and keeps the town advised of all the news in the area. Age: 40-60. Vocal part: Baritone

GRANDMA TZEITEL

Golde's deceased grandmother, who endorses the marriage between Tzeitel and Motel. Age: 60-75. Vocal part: Mezzo-Soprano.

FRUMA-SARAH

Lazar Wolf's deceased first wife. She becomes enraged when her husband plans to marry Tzeitel. Age: 35-45. Vocal part: Mezzo-Soprano

CONSTABLE

Russian military official stationed near Anatevka who knows the villagers well, however he has superficial relationships with the villagers. Age: 35-45. Vocal part: N/A

FYEDKA

A strong, young Russian soldier who sees past his military obligations and falls in love with Chava. He challenges Tevye's imposed silence. Age: 20-25. Vocal part: N/A

AUDITION HELP!

Choosing a Monologue

You must choose a one minute monologue to perform for the audition panel. You can either select your monologue or use one of the ones we are providing. Mrs. Pitner's website has a section titled "Find a Monologue" that can be helpful. Otherwise, visit the attached links and use the monologues on those sites for your audition.

Choosing a Song

You must choose a 30-second (16 bar) song to perform for the audition panel. Your song must be from a Broadway show. It cannot be a pop song. If you are not familiar with Broadway musicals, try looking up Disney movies that have been turned into musicals, such as *The Lion King, Beauty and the Beast,* or *The Little Mermaid*. You can also search for "Broadway audition songs" on the internet. Choose one that fits your range and also that shows the character/style of the musical you are auditioning for.

Audition Tips

- Be prepared!! The more prepared you feel, the more confident you will feel
- Before you begin your monologue, slate your piece. This means that you tell the audition
 panel the name of your monologue/the play the monologue is from and the author if you can
 find it
- When you end your piece, simply say "thank you"
- Remember that giving a monologue is not simply reciting lines you must act! Do your best to portray the character. Think about what they want and why they are saying these words.
- When delivering your monologue, pick ONE focus spot above the audition panels' heads to deliver your lines to. Pretend that spot is the person you are speaking to.
- Rehearse your entire audition, from when you enter the room to when you leave.
- <u>Songs to avoid</u>: anything from Wicked, Les Miserables, Hamilton or anything really popular/iconic.

Tips for Memorizing

- Write down your lines
- Run your lines with someone as many times as you can
- Go over your lines many times a day to stay fresh
- Practice your lines with blocking/movement
