### **Course Overview**

### **Course Description**

ENG840 Resource Language Arts 8 (One Year): Resource eighth grade ELA provides students with services as outlined in their Individualized Education Program (IEP). Students must meet the eligibility criteria to be placed in this class. Resource eighth-grade English Language Arts (ELA) uses the eighth-grade state standards. Resource eighth-grade ELA moves at an adapted pace and focuses more on the grade band anchor standards. This course emphasizes reading and writing for an entire year. In this standards-based curriculum, students will extend their writing skills through more complex compositions and reports, and their work will be assessed using the 6+1 traits of writing. Vocabulary development, prewriting strategies, and editing skills are emphasized. Students will write an expository essay that contains effective introductory and summary statements and fully developed ideas with details, facts, examples, and descriptions. Students will analyze literature through advanced literary techniques in poetry, short stories, plays, and novels. Students will also receive specially designed instruction and accommodations in their areas of need as outlined by their Individualized Education Program (IEP).
