- <u>CODE OF CONDUCT</u>: During the summer session, all students are expected to adhere to Chandler Unified School District's Code of Conduct at all times.

This course is also available for any student accepted into the AVID program.

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Junior High Math (Non-Credit)

Math 7 Prep (Non-credit): This course is designed to improve and extend standards-based math skills. Students will review and reinforce important concepts from Math 6 which include: number theory, basic operations (with fractions, decimals, and integers), multi-step and variable equations, proportions, graphing, statistics, and geometry. Students will use reasoning, communication and technology to solve real-world mathematical problems. This course is intended for students who may have struggled in Math 6, require a review of Math 6 topics, or are wanting to further prepare themselves for Math 7. (This is not for students intending to take Honors Math 7)

This course is intended for students entering 7th grade who will register for Honors Math 7 (or Math 8). This is also the course for future 7th grade AVID students.
