PSAT: More Than a Pre-Test


- Will be given PHS on October 30, 2019.
- Grades 9-11 can register August 17-September 13.
- The cost is \$20.00 and payment is made through your Infinite Campus Parent Portal.
- Offered to 9th, 10th, and 11th
- Scores can indicate how you will do on the SAT
- Scores can lead to National Merit Scholarships for qualifying Juniors

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Tips for Academic SUCCESS

- Plan ahead – The in-state universities look at the core unweighted GPA, SAT, ACT for admissions and scholarships.
- Keep grades up! A “D” is considered a deficiency.
- Get involved, stay involved –quality over quantity.
- Obtain leadership positions.
- Get informed about options –colleges, scholarships, trade schools.
- Get to know your teachers and counselor.

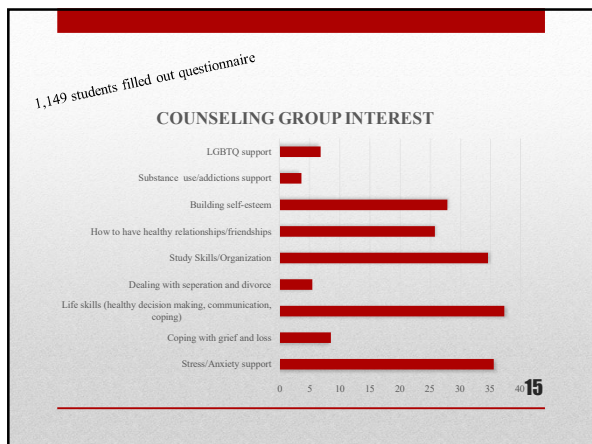
