COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Grades 9-12 Full year, 1 credit

DUAL ENROLLMENT CREDIT AVAILABLE

This course addresses the physical, social, emotional, and mental development of the child. Parental, caregiver, and occupational roles in early childhood professions will be examined. Students interact with children in the on-campus childcare center. **Course Fee: \$10**

*Note: All standards are taught through enrollment in the entire Early Childhood Education program.

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Students are expected to come to class with an ECE notebook (1-inch three-ringed binder), one set of binder tab dividers, loose-leaf lined paper, and a pen (blue or black ink only) every day to take notes as needed. Occasionally, students may need to purchase other supplies for a group project or lesson. Most other supplies and materials are provided.

An Early Childhood Education course fee of \$10 (for consumables used in class) must be paid to the HHS Bookstore within the first two weeks of school. Students who do not pay their course fee will not be allowed to participate in the Real Care Baby project.

Students are also required to obtain a TB Skin Test to be able to complete the internship component of the course. This test can range in price from \$30-\$60 dollars. Mrs. McGettigan will provide more information and details during first semester.

ACTIVE PARTICIPATION:

At the beginning of each quarter, each student has 100 points for participation. Five (5) points will be deducted for being tardy, lack of materials, off-task behavior, or disruptions from cell phones. Students are required to actively participate in class. Participation means completing all assignments (textbook, written, group and oral), maintaining a notebook, and getting involved in group/class discussions, group activities, and participating in childcare lab experiences. In addition, students will be conducting self-evaluations and peer-evaluations, responding to films and guest speakers, and preparing for tests and quizzes.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS:

Students are expected to follow all classroom rules and procedures in addition to school wide rules (See Student Handbook). Respect for all members of the classroom and their belongings at all times. No profanity is allowed in the classroom. In addition, make-up and personal hygiene activities are inappropriate for the classroom. In the classroom, all students must follow the district BYOT "Bring Your Own Technology" agreement for electronic devices (including cell phones, I-Pods, laptops, etc.). No food, gum or drinks are allowed in the classroom.

IN-PERSON ATTENDANCE and TARDY POLICIES:

Be in your seat when the bell rings. Students, who come to class tardy 3 times per semester, will be issued a conduct referral to their grade level Assistant Principal. Students who accumulate a total of more than 9 excused/unexcused absences may be removed from the course.

VIRTUAL ATTENDANCE:

Attendance is based on engagement. If a student is not present for synchronous instruction and does not complete the asynchronous/alternative assignment for the daily class meeting, then the student is considered absent. Teachers will contact attendance clerks once a student is determined to be absent.

CONSEQUENCES:

Unexcused absences, tardies, and inappropriate classroom behavior may result in detention--lunch, before or after school.

1st infraction - Warning

2nd infraction –Parent contact and mandatory 15-minute detention assigned

3rd infraction - Parent contact and referral to admin may be issued

GRADING SYSTEM:

Grades are based on class participation, assignments, tests, quizzes, and lab experiences. Classroom activities and assignments will be worth points. Points will be assigned based on significance, difficulty, and time involved. Grades will be based on a percentage of total points earned, according to the following scale:

MAKE-UP WORK:

Students may only make-up work from <u>excused</u> absences. Students will be notified of a due date for each assignment. To receive full credit, assignments must be turned in during class on the date it is due. If an assignment is turned in after that time, points will be deducted (half credit). I reserve the right to refuse any assignment turned in after one week past the due date.

Some assignments and class activities (including group projects and labs) cannot be made up and an alternative assignment may be given for excused absences only.

In the event you are absent, it is <u>your responsibility</u> to get your make-up work from me. Assignments will be accepted within the same number of days that the student is absent and no more than one week late. <u>No extended due dates will</u> <u>be given for semester or year-long projects—even for excused absences—so students must plan accordingly.</u> It may be necessary to obtain make-up work outside of class time (before or after school).

TUTORING/EXTRA HELP:

I am available for tutoring and/or extra help from 2:25-3:00 p.m. Monday-Thursday. Please let me know ahead of time if you plan to come in because, occasionally I will have another commitment on campus and will not be available.

EXTRA CREDIT:

Occasionally I will offer assignments for extra credit or points for an assignment that was exceptionally well done. *Please note that extra credit cannot be used to pass the course in the event of non-attendance and/or non-participation.*

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION LAB:

Students enrolled in the Early Childhood Education Program will participate in internship/lab experiences in the Hamilton Lil' Express Child Care. A separate permission form and student handbook will be presented before entering the childcare component of the program and is available on class website. During the childcare lab experience component of the class, students are expected to:

- * Conduct themselves professionally
- * Dress appropriately
- * Follow policies and procedures of the childcare
- * Maintain confidentiality
- * Be on time

Students, who do not follow the above guidelines, will be counseled and parents may be contacted. Students, who do not conduct themselves in a professional manner, may be excluded from the lab experience temporarily or permanently and will have to complete alternative assignments. This internship is part of the student's grade. Tardies and absences effect internship part of the grade.

Please note that students must have a TB test before entering the childcare center or have a current record (within 1 year) of a negative TB test on file.

DUAL ENROLLMENT:

Students have the opportunity, to earn *3 college credits per year* in this course. Dual Enrollment is available through Maricopa Community Colleges. Students may inquire about Dual Enrollment on the Chandler Gilbert Community College website (www.cgc.edu/dual) for more information. Although this is a year-long class, payment to CGCC for dual enrollment is due in mid-September and there are no exceptions.
