

# Photography Club Constitution

## Article 1

The name of the organization shall be referred to as the Photography Club.

## Article 2

The purpose of the Photography Club shall be to promote creativity through photography, to share and critique the photographs of peers, to educate and improve technical skills, and to spread the love of photography throughout the community.

## Article 3

**DUES AND MEMBERSHIP:** The Photography Club is open to all students currently enrolled in any Photography course at Casteel High School. The membership dues of the Photography Club will be \$10 per year.

## Article 4

**ORGANIZATION AND ACTIVITIES:** The Photography Club shall be organized by Casteel High School student members. Activities may consist of participation, attendance, and support of school-sponsored activities.

**OFFICERS:** The officers of the club shall consist of a minimum of four officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Officers are appointed once a year in August by the sponsor and/or election. Duties to include:

President: Convenes regularly scheduled students club meetings, preside or arrange for other members to preside at each meeting in the following order: Vice President, Secretary, or Treasurer.

Vice President: Chairs committees on special subjects as designated by the club members.

Secretary: Responsibility for maintaining records of club action, including overseeing of taking minutes at all club meetings, and sending out meeting announcements.

Treasurer: Keep an accurate account of all club funds and summarize the amount of the account upon request of the President or Sponsor.

## Article 5

**MEETINGS:** Meetings will be every Wednesday during conference period. The purpose of the meetings will vary depending on circumstances. If an emergency meeting is needed, there will be an announcement made via school announcements.

## Article 6

**AMENDMENTS:** Amendments to the constitution may be proposed by any active officers of the organization. In order for an amendment to be enacted, the organization must convene a meeting open to all members and pass a vote of majority on the proposed amendment.
