SPECIAL NEEDS: Arizona FCCLA recognizes the special needs of our members. If any member has a special need that will require accommodation, the member is requested to inform Arizona FCCLA of such needs so accommodation can be made.

DRESS CODE: FCCLA is, first and foremost, a **professional** organization for students enrolled in Family and Consumer Science Education. Just as in a business where company policies related to dress and grooming are maintained, FCCLA has developed its own policies. Essentially, proper dress and grooming for any occasion is a matter of exercising good judgment; thus, should a question arise concerning the Dress Code, contact your chapter adviser or refer to this form <u>prior</u> to making a decision. Help us to build and maintain a positive image of FCCLA! All FCCLA activities must be attended in appropriate professional attire; absolutely no jeans or shorts.

FCCLA members and advisers should develop an awareness of the image one's appearance projects. The purpose of the dress code is to uphold the positive and professional image of the association and its members and to prepare students for the business world.

Appropriate attire is required for all attendees – <u>advisers</u>, <u>members</u> and <u>guests</u> – at all general sessions, competitive events, regional meetings, workshops and other activities unless otherwise stated in the conference program. Conference name badges are part of this dress code and must be worn for all conference functions. For safety reasons, do not wear name badges when touring.

Females

Professional attire acceptable for FCCLA activities include:

Males

- <u>Shirts</u>: Red, black or white polo or oxford shirt (long or short sleeves).
- <u>Pants</u>: Black dress slacks. All pants are to be worn at the waist.
- <u>Shoes</u>: Black dress shoes.
- <u>Ties</u>: Optional and must be professional in appearance.
- The FCCLA official blazer is always appropriate and strongly encouraged, although not required.

<u>Shirts</u>: Red, black or white polo or oxford shirt (long or short sleeves).

- Skirt/Pants: Black skirts or black dress slacks. A black, knee-length or longer skirt (one-inch above the knee). A black shift dress is also an option in place of the skirt, but the length must also be at the knee or longer.
- <u>Shoes</u>: Black pumps (no higher than 2inch heels) or black flats.
- <u>Ties</u>: Optional and must be professional in appearance.
- The FCCLA official blazer is always appropriate and strongly encouraged, although not required.
- NO part of the skirt or shirt may be sheer.

Note: Chef Coats and appropriate chef pants are allowed ONLY for students competing in Culinary Arts. Appropriate shoes must be worn when not competing. The students must change for other competitions or activities at the conference.

Inappropriate attire, for both men and women, includes:

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- Visible body piercing, other than ears.
- Denim or chambray fabric clothing of any kind, flannel fabric, overly baggy jeans, stretch/stirrup/legging pants, overalls, shorts, skorts, exercise or bike shorts.
- Backless, see-through/sheer, tight-fitting, spaghetti straps, strapless, off-the-shoulder or lowcut blouses/tops.
- Extremely short dresses/skirts (shorter than one-inch above the knee).
- T-shirts, spandex, midriff tops, tank tops or bathing suits.
- Stiletto heels, flip flops, sandals, slippers, athletic shoes, Vans, Toms, industrial work shoes, hiking boots, bare feet or over-the-knee boots.
- Hats, bandanas, visors, etc.
- Bolo ties.
- Visible foundation garments/undergarments.

POOL ATTIRE: If a swimming pool, jacuzzi, sauna, etc., is available for student use, the following dress is appropriate ONLY when traveling to and from and when using such facilities: Robe or teeshirt, swimming suit, shoes or sandals. NOTE: Under no circumstances are students permitted in the hotel lobby or in any other portion of conference facilities or surrounding area in Pool Attire.

CONDUCT CODE: Participation in Arizona FCCLA activities provides an opportunity for students to interact with family and consumer science professionals, adult FCCLA supporters, other FCCLA members and the general public. As a result of establishing a positive, ethical and professional image many businesses, civic organizations and individuals provide financial and human resources to FCCLA and its student members. Once again, should you have a question concerning what constitutes acceptable behavior, ask your adviser or chaperone prior to making a decision. FCCLA values its reputation and asks that you help maintain it. The following Conduct Code has been established and is enforced at all area, state and national FCCLA conferences and activities.

LEVEL ONE VIOLATIONS: The following have been identified as "extremely serious" violations:

- 1. Rudeness or insubordination.
- 2. Violation of any city, state, or federal law.
- 3. Possession, consumption, transportation, or purchase of any alcoholic beverage or illegal drug. If alcoholic beverages and/or illegal drugs or evidence of their use are found in a hotel room, all occupants of that room shall be subjected to the penalties prescribed below.
- 4. Defacing, damaging, or stealing public or private property.
- 5. Failure to attend conference activities, including competitive events, general sessions, and special meetings.
- 6. Male in female's room or female in male's room WITHOUT AN OPEN DOOR and without the permission of a chapter adviser or chaperone.
- 7. Missing curfew by more than 30 minutes. Curfew means being in your assigned room with the door closed and noise kept at a minimum. If you are not staying in the hotel, curfew means that you have left the hotel grounds by the stated time.
- 8. Throwing any object from a hotel window or vehicle.
- 9. Inviting or having non-FCCLA members or unregistered individuals in your hotel room at a conference or activity. 'he Ultimate
- 10. Repeated violation of Level Two Conduct Codes.
- 11. Violations not mentioned as identified by the adviser, chaperone, state staff, and/or school official. eadersnip

LEVEL ONE PENALTIES:

- 1. Expulsion from the conference.
- Notification of the parent or guardian. 2.
- 3. Notification of a school official.
- Student, parent/guardian, and Adviser must immediately arrange and pay for alternate travel 4. plans to return home.
- 5. Forfeiture of all awards, moneys, scholarships, travel grants, and future opportunities to participate in Arizona FCCLA activities. National Conference travel scholarships shall be returned to Arizona FCCLA.
- 6. Other penalties at the discretion of the adviser, chaperone, school official, or state staff.

LEVEL TWO VIOLATIONS: The following have been identified as less serious violations **but**, **if repeated**, student may be subjected to penalties similar or equal to those prescribed for Level One Violations:

- 1. Failure to follow the Arizona FCCLA Dress Code.
- 2. <u>Smoking</u> in public during the conference.
- 3. Failure to wear identification <u>badges</u> during the conference.
- 4. <u>Tardiness</u> to conference activities. If tardy by 30 minutes or more, a Level One penalty applies.
- 5. <u>Leaving the conference</u> site without the knowledge of your adviser or chaperone.
- 6. <u>Missing curfew</u> by less than 30 minutes and by not being in your assigned room with the door closed and noise kept to a minimum.
- 7. <u>Other violations</u> not mentioned above but identified by the adviser, chaperone, state staff, or school official.

LEVEL TWO PENALTIES:

- 1. Verbal and written warning and immediate compliance with conference rules.
- 2. Notification of chapter adviser and State FCCLA Staff.
- 3. Repeat violations or the violation of another Level Two Code may result in Level One penalties.
