Chandler Unified School District's Native American program receives its financial support from two federally funded programs: **Title VI** and the **Johnson-O'Malley** (JOM) program.


- Both program funds are available for the unique educational and culturally related academic needs of American Indian and Alaskan Native students enrolled in a CUSD school (we are unable to provide any funding support to students in Chandler charter or private schools).
 - Both require participation by *Indian Education Parent Committee* (IPC) members.

WHO CAN ENROLL IN TITLE VI AND/OR JOM?

- CUSD students who are members of a federally recognized tribe, band, or other organized group of Native Americans
- Children/grandchildren of any such member mentioned above

HOW TO ENROLL IN OUR PROGRAM:

For students to participate in most of our services, they must be enrolled in our program.

Available Services

Once registered in the Title VI and/or the Johnson O'Malley program, Native American students may be eligible to receive one or more of services outlined below.
