Course Description:

Pre-calculus includes topics from college algebra and trigonometry. Students may elect to take this for dual credit.

Topics Covered:

- Functions and Graphs
- Transformations
- Trigonometric Functions and Graphs
- Vectors and Parametric Equations
- Polar coordinates and Complex Numbers
- Conics
- Exponential and Logarithmic Functions

College Credit Options:

Dual Credit: Perry High School, in conjunction with Chandler Gilbert Community College, offers high school students dual credit opportunities. All students must pass prerequisite qualifications in order to take this class for college credit. Students must maintain a minimum of a "C" average and pay the tuition fees to CGCC in order to receive college credit for this course. A total of 5 college credit hours MAT187 can be earned upon successful completion of this course. **Registration occurs in early August.** More information regarding prerequisite qualifications, tuition fees and specific dates will be announced at a future date and will be available online.

It is very important that you check with the college of your choice to see what their specific requirements are for determining credit.

Prerequisite: Completion of Algebra 2 or Year 4 Math is required. You need to understand that this is a college-level course and that the standards are high. Be sure that you are ready to work at a high level all year.

Classroom Expectations:

It is required that ALL electronics (except a calculator – not a phone app) be stowed out of reach and silent during quizzes, tests or any other form of examination.

- Graphing Calculator: TI-83 or TI-84
 - A phone app is ok to use for assignments, but NOT for quizzes or tests, need an actual graphing calculator
- 3-Ring Binder for notes, handouts and assignments
- Paper, Pencils & Erasers

Absences and Work:

You are expected to make up any work missed because of an excused absence including any class work. **It is your responsibility** to find out what work was done while you were absent, check the white board, website or contact me. FIELD TRIPS

You are responsible for getting the missed assignment during a field trip or school sponsored activity. The assignment will be collected the next class period. There are no extra make up days for assignments missed during a field trip.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES WILL RESULT IN A ZERO FOR THAT DAY'S ASSIGNMENT.

Grades and Assignments:

- Grades are cumulative; your final grades are the semester grades in December and May, we do not start over in October and March.
- All class work, homework, and warm-ups will make up 20% of the cumulative grade throughout the semester.
- Grades are based on the following
 - 1) **Warm-ups** may be done daily. It is your responsibility to get it completed in a timely manner. *Any warm-up could count as a quiz.*
 - 2) **Assignments** are given daily, (worth 5 pts/day) I will stamp homework at the beginning of class. If your homework is not done when I stamp, you will not receive full credit. There is no late homework!
 - Assignments are checked for COMPLETION with all work shown in order to receive credit.
 - DO NOT just copy answers.
 - Each assignment must have:
 - Your name
 - Due date
 - Period
 - Assignment name

**** if a self-assessment score of 2 or lower is accurate, student should be coming in OUTSIDE of class time to get help or clarification.**

- 3) **Tests/Quizzes** will be worth 80% of the cumulative grade. They are announced. Reviews will be given before test, but they may not be all inclusive, nor parallel.
 - **Test must be completed in the allotted time, no additional time will be given to complete test, pace yourself accordingly.**
 - If you have an **excused absence** the test or quiz you missed must be made up within **48 hours (2 school days)**. If you are absent during a test review day, you will be expected to take the test when you return to class. You will receive a zero for not making up any test or quiz.
 - **NO QUIZ/TEST RETAKES.**
- 4) **Final exam** is worth 20% of your final semester grade
- 5) Your cumulative grade is worth 80% of your final semester grade
