A.R.S. §15-259 establishes the State Seal of Civics Literacy (Program) This program recognizes high school students who have attained a high level of proficiency in Civics at the time of graduation

Students also are eligible for more than two dozen special awards sponsored by various organizations, with values ranging from \$250 to \$2,500.


