**Geography -** The science that describes the surface of the earth and it's associated physical, biological, economical, political, and demographic characteristics


**Continent** - A major land mass separated from other large land masses by water or racial differences

For instance: North America is separated from South America water

Africa is separated from Asia and Europe by mostly Water and race

Australia is totally separated by water


Europe is separated from Asia by race




**Hemispheres**\_- the earth is divided into four hemispheres; northern, southern, eastern and western. (answer questions)

Plate tectonics — The earth is divided into plates that move around on its surface. When they converge they form mountains, volcanoes, or cause earth quakes.

- ❖Continental Drift Theory Approximately 225 million years ago, only one huge super continent of Pangaea existed. Eventually the continents all drifted apart.
- ❖The "Ring of Fire," where most of the world's volcanic activity takes place, surrounds the Pacific Plate
- ❖The San Andreas fault in California is the movement of the Pacific Plate and the American Plate


VOCABULARY

**Latitude** – The lines that go around the earth from <u>east</u> to west. They measure the distance north or south of <u>the equator</u>.

Longitude (meridians) The lines that go around
the earth from north to
south, meeting at the
poles. They measure
distances east and west.




**Equator -** The line that is halfway between the north and south poles.



**Tropic of Cancer** – The line that marks the <u>northern</u> most point that the sun is directly overhead at the summer solstice. (23 1/2° north of the equator)

**Tropic of Capricorn** – The line that marks the <u>southern</u> most point that the sun is directly overhead at the winter solstice (23 1/2° south of the equator)



**Prime Meridian** - 0° longitude, goes through Greenwich, England.

International Date Line - The invisible line at approximately 180° longitude, which when traveling across going west a day is gained, going east a day is lost.


**Time Zones -** 24 in the world. Each 15° from the Prime Meridian is 1 hour

**BC or BCE -** "Before Common Era" – aka Before Christian Era

**AD or CE -** "Anno Domini", which translates to "the Year of Our Lord or ".Common Era"






**Maps** - a flat representation of the earth. Distorted due to the curve of the earth.


**Globe** – A spherical model of the earth.










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
### **Projections** – ways of <u>flattening</u> the globe onto a map.

### **Desert -** a region that receives less than 8 inches of rain per year



Steppe - a flat grassland with no trees

Rain Forest - A wet, tropical, densely wooded area with tall trees forming a canopy which blocks the sun and has many varieties of plants.



Climate - the long-term weather pattern of a region.

Climate is mostly determined by Latitude

**Seasons** – the yearly cycle of variations in the weather. They are caused by the tilt in the earth's axis.



**Weather -** the daily and hourly fluctuations and variations in the earth's atmosphere such as temperature, humidity, and precipitation.
