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Black History Month Celebration

CUSD celebrated Black history on Wednesday at the Governing Board meeting. African American school administrators read the Black History Proclamation and Heather Tawney, sixth grade teacher from Ryan Elementary School, shared a Black History lesson taught to her class that highlighted other "change makers" from the Civil Rights movement.

Claudette Colvin, a young 15 year old, lesser known change agent who participated and took action during the Civil Rights Movement. Claudette was arrested for refusing to give up her seat on a bus in Montgomery, Alabama. She was charged and served time in jail because she chose to take action and participate in improving the repressive parameters in the lives of black Americans. Students discussed Claudette Colvin's character traits and saw her as brave, passionate, stubborn, and confident. Students engaged and explored the idea of participating in change by analyzing the actions of Claudette and constructing their own action ideas to participate in supporting the changes they felt passionate about. Some students wrote about conserving water, some wrote about defending LGBTQ minorities, and some wrote about standing up against racism and discrimination towards people of color and individuals with disabilities. Their ideas and words are full of hope and positive change to come, inspired by the same hope and positive change that has taken place because of black Americans such as Claudette Colvin.

The Black history celebration concluded with a tribute to Dr. Casteel through the poem of Amanda Gorman the 2021 Inaugural Poet

"for there is always light if only we're brave enough to SEE it, if only we're brave enough to BE it."




Hamilton High School senior Ariz Zhu has been named a Coca Cola Scholarship Regional Finalist!
