Chandler High School is an open campus. Students are allowed to leave campus during the Summer Academy program. CUSD Food and Nutrition will provide breakfast/lunch each day.

- **ENROLLMENT:** Each student should review his/her transcript with their guidance counselor. After reviewing the transcript, the guidance counselor will pre-enroll students into the courses they've determine are needed for recovery or Next Step. An email listing the courses will automatically generate to the student and his/her parents. *PRE-ENROLLMENT DOES NOT GUARANTEE A SLOT IN ANY COURSE.* After receiving the email and reviewing the details, the parent/student will log into their Infinite Campus account to pay for the courses. Submitting payment for the course is the only way to secure a slot in the class. **STUDENTS ARE NOT OFFICIALLY ENROLLED IN ANY COURSE UNTIL FULL PAYMENT HAS BEEN SUBMITTED.**

- **CODE OF CONDUCT:** During the summer session, all students are expected to adhere to Chandler Unified School District's Code of Conduct at all times.
- **DRESS CODE:** Students are expected to adhere to the CUSD Dress Code during Summer Academy. For dress code violations, students will be sent to the Summer Academy office to call home for a change of clothing. Repeat occurrences will result in a parent meeting.
- **TRANSPORTATION:** Transportation services are NOT available.
- **BREAKFAST/LUNCHES:** Students can purchase breakfast and lunch from CUSD Food Services each day.
- **ATTENDANCE & TARDIES:** Students may miss two days of Summer Academy. If they miss a third day, the student will be disenrolled with no credit earned and no refund. Three tardies equals one absence. One hour or more late to class will equal an absence. Leaving early one hour or more is an absence. Please see below regarding final exams.
- **FINAL EXAMS:** Final exams are given on the last day. **All students must attend the last day of class.** An absence on the last day will jeopardize credit for the course. All fees are nonrefundable.
- **NEXT STEP:** Next Step is available for on track students with a desire to fit other courses into their rigorous schedule during the school year. Next Step students attend Summer Academy for "credit advancement" one semester prior to their regular academic course schedule.
- **GRADES:** Summer Academy grades will NOT be mailed. Final Grades will be posted to the Student Portal in Infinite Campus. To access the student portal, students/parents will log onto www.cusd80.com then select the "Parents and

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Students" tab followed by "Parent and Student Portal - Online Grades". Click Infinite Campus Parent and Student Online Portal located in the center of the screen. Student will then enter his/her unique username and password.

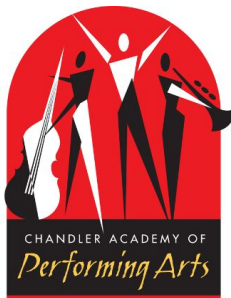
