1. Welcome and Review of Agenda – 7:30 am

1.01 Barb welcomed everyone and reviewed the agenda. Frank thanked Food and Nutrition for the breakfast. Frank also introduced Brian Stinson, Peak Fleet.

2. Information Items

2.01 School Safety

Safety Presentation conducted by Mark Huish, Ken James, and Dr. Mike De La Torre. The presentation provided the Board with information on School Safety Systems. Systems discussed were Weapons Detection Systems, Wearable Technology Systems, Vape Sensors, and Clear Bag Policy for CUSD. Mr. Huish presented Pros and Cons as well as costs if available.

Questions from the Board:

How often is active shooter training held?

We currently conduct fire, lockdown and evacuation drills.

It was suggested to train at the start of each school year.

How many staffing positions will be requited for metal detectors?

Up to 15 per high school, \$18-\$20K.

Did door locks switch to locking from the inside?

Yes.

Stephanie Ingersoll, Executive Director for Marketing and Communications presented the district's marketing plan including the CUSD website redesign.

2.03 Staff Retention and Turnover

Chris Rossini, Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources provided information on exit interviews, why are people leaving and implementing new hire surveys and stay surveys. Exit interviews show the majority of staff leaving is due to retirement.

Feedback from the Board:

- Teachers do not like administrative tasks.
- Create a teaching path in CTE.
- Rename Early Childhood to ED Professions.

2.04 <u>Athletics – Recruiting and Retaining</u>

Shawn Rustad, Director of Secondary Athletics, discussed what it takes to attract and retain quality coaches. Shared a clip of the upcoming movie "Unstoppable" based on a true story on the HHS wrestling coach Anthony Robles. Also shared Coaches Clinics are happening and they are presented by our CUSD coaches.

2.05 Artificial Intelligence

Shaun Creighton, Director of Instructional Technology, presented an update on Artificial Intelligence in the classroom. About 50 percent of teachers use it, about 30% of students ages 12-17 use it for school. Mr. Creighton discussed the benefits and risks of AI. CUSD Artificial Intelligence Framework has been implemented and will continue to update as Artificial Intelligence evolves.

Questions from the Board:

Do kids under 13 have access to AI sites on their District device? No, access is given based on grade level.
