Ready for School: My School

Big Idea: I am getting to know my school.

Concepts: Going to school, riding the bus, the crossing guard, school helpers, my classroom, daily schedule and routines, manners and good behavior, on my own, all about me **Theme Vocabulary:** class, name, school, teacher

Science:

Cloud Watchers: In *Cloud Watchers*, children learn that clouds are made up of water droplets. Children venture outdoors to notice similarities and differences among the many clouds in the sky. Some clouds are white, and others are gray; some clouds look puffy or resemble familiar objects. With a clipboard in one hand and a piece of chalk in the other, children observe and draw the clouds they see. Children also read the ECHOS book *What Falls from a Cloud?*

Math:

Same and Different: The process of identifying and describing attributes is centered on how objects, sounds, and so on are alike and not alike. For children to gain the numeracy necessary for future success, they must first be able to see the detail in objects and situations. Once they are knowledgeable of similarities and differences, they are then able to analyze their learning and engage in the critical reasoning skills necessary for success.
