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Week of 1/10/17 – Learning in our Classroom

<u>5th Grade Reading</u>: Students will read <u>We Were There, Too!</u> This is a biography. We will focus on explaining how the relationships between individuals/events/concepts in a text impact our reading and comprehension of informative texts.

<u>Accelerated Reading</u>: The students will be starting a new literature study on <u>The Candy Shop War</u> or <u>Hatchet</u>. They will get a new menu that focuses on the human body. The close read for the week is: *The Cells That Make Us*. <u>5th Grade Math</u>: The students will begin chapter 8 on Decimals and Fractions. The focus will be on simplest form and greatest common factor.

<u>Accelerated Math</u>: Students will be starting chapter 7 on Equations. They will apply what we learned in our last chapter with expressions and now solve for a variable.

<u>Science/Social Studies</u>: The students will be participating in an American Revolution Simulation. They will get to experience some of what it was like being a soldier during the war. It's a great hands-on way to learn about this time in history. **Mark your Calendars** - Science Fair presentations will be held on January 18, from 9:00-9:45 and 1:45-2:30.
