Student Responsibilities

Coming into the Classroom: When you arrive at the classroom, please wait outside of the classroom in line, and wait until the teacher ask you to enter the classroom. When you enter the classroom, firstly, take a writing scratch sheet from the green basket on the teacher's desk; secondly, put your phone in the Cellphone closet pocket; thirdly, if the class has a current writing sheet for the new lesson, the writing sheets should be put on your desk to let the teacher check that you did the daily writing practice. Student Commitment to Learning: Students are expected to keep up in their prep work for daily class meetings-reviewing vocabulary, practicing how to write the new characters with writing sheets, completing the assignments on the workbook or other handouts. To ensure success, students should study, do homework and practice writing characters at least 30 minutes every day. In-classroom writing sheet: Students will have one piece of in-classroom writing sheet every day. The students should write down and practice the new vocabulary, key words, and sentences on this piece of paper, and I will check it at the end of the class. The students must write down their names and the date on the top of this paper and keep every day's in-classroom paper at a safe and accessible location. Parents can also ask the students to show their daily writing sheet to check what the student's progress day by day. This paper will be handed out every day except for the first 2 weeks of Mandarin I class. Students also will need the note they write on this paper to complete their homework and review for the test and quizzes.

Late work

There are 3 kinds of homework: Workbook, Writing Sheets, and other classwork. Workbook and Writing sheets will be handed out at the beginning of each new lesson, and the students will have approximately 1 or 1 and half week to complete them, the due date of workbook and writing sheets will be put on the homework schedule zone on the whiteboard as a reminder.

Writing Sheets homework is a daily work, although it only needs to be turned in on the due date, students cannot wait until the due date to complete the writing sheets; they should divide the writing sheet to a daily work. Each character on the writing sheet needs to be repeated at least three times per day until the due date. Writing sheets should be on your desk at the beginning of class. Please be cautious that complete the writing sheets is a daily routine homework, if you complete it in one day, it will not have a passing grade. Assignments (Compositions, projects, teacher graded homework): All assignments (whether for grade or not) are carefully chosen to enhance subject comprehension. For teacher graded work, the work is due for grade and is not completed on time, 10% will be deducted from the grade on the assignment each day it is late. After 4 days, 0% will be given on the assignment. Late HW/Assignments: All late assignments for a lesson will only be accepted until the end of the one week after we complete the lesson (Lesson Quiz). Previous unit/lesson work will not be accepted for late work grade.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Assessments - 50%

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
