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Week of 11/7/16 - Learning in our Classroom

5th Grade Reading: Students are taking the ELA and Science Galileo test on Monday and Tuesday. Now that we have finished our literature book <u>Frindle</u>, we are back in our Harcourt textbook focusing on an informational text called "Cougars." Students will be assigned the 10 vocabulary words from this chapter, but will continue to study the academic vocabulary words we focused on this quarter.

<u>Accelerated Reading</u>: The students will be finishing up their forces and motion menu. They will be focusing on citing textual evidence to support their answers. They will also continue finding figurative language while doing a literature study of <u>Where the Mountain Meets the Moon</u>.

<u>Writing</u>: Students will continue to work on informative writing strategies and begin to apply their skills on a writing prompt to answer the question, "What led Tecumseh to fight?".

5th Grade Math: The students should prepare for their Chapter 5 assessment on adding and subtracting decimals. They will then move to Chapter 6 on multiplying and dividing decimals.

<u>Accelerated Math</u>: Students will do Galileo testing on Monday. We will then move into Chapter 5 learning about integers and the coordinate plane.

<u>Science/Social Studies</u>: Students are continuing to explore Forces and Motion and will be tested on Thursday. Please encourage your student to study for this end of unit assessment using their Define and Draw.
